### Bolivia's Junta Celebrates First Anniversary Of Rule

By VICTOR HUGO VILLEGAS LA PAZ (Reuters)—Bolivia's ruling military junta Thursday celebrated the first anniversary of its rise to power amid serious political, social and economic problems and speculation it will call long-awaited national elections.

The Nov. 4, 1964, revolution ousted President Victor Paz Estenssoro's 12-year regime and brought current co-president, Gen. Rene Barrientos Ortuño, to power. Since then, the junta has promised on several occasions to call a national poll.

But elections were postponed each time in the face of violent outbreaks among the nation's militant tin miners.

Public ceremonies marking the junta's first year in power will be held here and in Cochabamba, the country's second city, today.

It was in Cochabamba that Barrientos, then vice-president, launched his revolution. Barrientos ruled the junta alone until last May when Gen. Ovando Candia was appointed co-president.

Barrientos remarked recently that he would call general elections "provided an auspicious climate exists."

Ovando has already said publicly he would not contest the presidency.

REINSTATE GUARANTEES

Although Bolivia lacks constitutional guarantees, under the junta citizens' guarantees have been reinstated and the floundering national mining economy has been partially bolstered.

The junta's relations with Bolivian political parties have, however, deteriorated. And a drastic reduction in miners' wages May 1 brought sharp reaction — long stoppages and bloody violence at state-owned mines.

Broadly speaking, the nationalization of Bolivia's tin mines in 1952 has proved a technical and administrative failure. It caused considerable losses and reduction of output, leading to a deterioration of the entire Bolivian economy.

The junta has tried to rectify steps taken by the previous government by reorganizing the labor force and reducing wages. But this has only added to general unrest among the miners and has also led to serious social problems.

GET PILGRIM'S REWARD

AMSTERDAM (AP)—A diamond the size of a small matchbox, estimated to be worth \$150,000 to \$450,000 and found in the Indonesian jungle two months ago, was displayed at the Asscher diamond plant in this Dutch city Thursday. The 166.85-carat gem, one of the biggest diamonds to be found since the Second War was found by a group of 40 persons who handed it to the police. President Sukarno, who named the stone Tri Sakti (Three Supernatural Powers), rewarded the group with a Hadji (pilgrimage) trip to Mecca.

JOIN VIET WAR

TOKYO (Reuters)—A fleet of nuclear-powered U.S. navy vessels, comprising the aircraft carrier Enterprise, the guided missile frigate Bainbridge and the cruiser Long Beach, may join the U.S. 7th Fleet for Viet Nam operations, the Japanese national daily Asahi Shimbun says. The newspaper attributed the report to reliable U.S. navy sources in Yokosuka, near Tokyo. A U.S. navy spokesman said the Enterprise and Bainbridge were expected in the Pacific late this month.

### New Processing Plant For Fish In Shippegan

HALIFAX — A \$1,000,000 sea-food processing plant capable of handling 20,000,000 pounds of fresh fish per season will be built in Shippegan, New Brunswick, by Eagle Fisheries Division of National Sea Products Limited. It will replace the company's former processing plant on the same site which was destroyed by fire August 8 this year.

The announcement was made jointly today by C. J. Morrow, chairman of National Sea Products Ocean Fisheries Limited, Halifax, and Hon. R. Ernest Richard, minister of fisheries for New Brunswick.

New Brunswick's department of fisheries and industrial development board are assisting the company's rebuilding program. It is hoped construction can begin within a few weeks so that the plant will be operative in time for next spring's fishing season. The new plant, which will be equipped with the most recently developed machinery

available to the fish processing industry, will employ 175 men and women to start, about the same number employed in the former plant. It is expected that employment will increase from this figure as production rises.

Manager of Eagle Fisheries is John A. Rabasse. Following the fire this summer, when many employees would have been out of work, an effort was made to find temporary jobs for many employees in neighboring fish plants, who also handled trawler catches normally destined for Eagle. The plant is supplied by fisherman-owned trawlers.

It is expected that a new fish meal plant capable of processing 10 tons of raw fish per hour will be incorporated with the new filleting plant.

Not destroyed in the August fire and still operating are the lobster cannery and ice-making plant. In addition to processing and packaging seafood products, the division fast freezes blueberries.

### Consumer Goods Use Shows Drop In Russia

By HENRY S. BRADSHAW MOSCOW (AP)—The supply of imported consumer goods declined in Soviet stores last year because of the 1963 wheat-crop failure statistics showed Wednesday, the effects of this year's wheat shortage are still being measured.

The crop failure also left Soviet satellites paying more for their wheat from the Soviet Union than the U.S.S.R. paid for Western wheat imports in 1964 to make up for the 1963 failure. Statistics show that the sharp cut in other imports, made to compensate for the wheat, was in manufactured consumer goods.

The Soviet Union paid an average of \$67.76 a metric ton for 1964 wheat imports. But, it also sold wheat last year, primarily to East Europe and Cuba, at an average price of \$74.82 a metric ton.

These statistics have just been published in the foreign trade report for 1964.

The 1964 harvest was good, meaning the current figures for 1964 will show lower food imports. But the 1965 crop has been poor. The Soviet Union already has contracted to import 9,500,000 metric tons of wheat and might have to buy even more.

EARNINGS SCARCE Both in 1963 and again now, the Soviet Union has sold gold to pay for the wheat. This indi-

icates a shortage of export earnings to pay hard currency to Western nations for wheat.

Trade statistics for both 1963 and 1964, however, show nearly a balance between imports and exports. The 1964 figures were given as \$915,000,000 rubles (\$7,881,000,000) in exports and \$963,000,000 rubles (\$7,738,000,000) in imports.

Much of the exports were to Communist-bloc countries that paid in soft currencies unacceptable to Western wheat producers. This forced the gold sales.

The largest element of Soviet exports was ores, metals and cables. They made up 21.3 per cent by value in 1964. Machinery and equipment was 21 per cent and fuel and electric energy 18 per cent.

Machinery and equipment took up 34.4 per cent of imports in 1964. Food was 20.1 per cent and manufactured consumer goods 15.4 per cent.

Food imports rose sharply to the 20.1 per cent in 1964 from 12.8 per cent of the 1963 total, because of the wheat failure. The percentages of all other types of imports, except machinery and timber products, were cut.

CONSUMER GOODS CUT But consumer goods were cut the most. They dropped from 18.3 per cent in 1963, to 15.4 per cent. This came as Soviet political leaders were promising more and better consumer

goods to the Soviet people. Consumer imports ranged from 418,000,000 rubles (\$464,000,000) worth of clothes to 1,979,000 rubles (\$2,199,000) worth of razor blades.

Western students of Soviet trade have long noted that satellites are charged a higher price than other countries.

The trade statistics reflected the continuing decline of Soviet-Chinese relations. Trade both ways was 1,364,000,000 rubles in 1963 but only 404,500,000 rubles last year.
