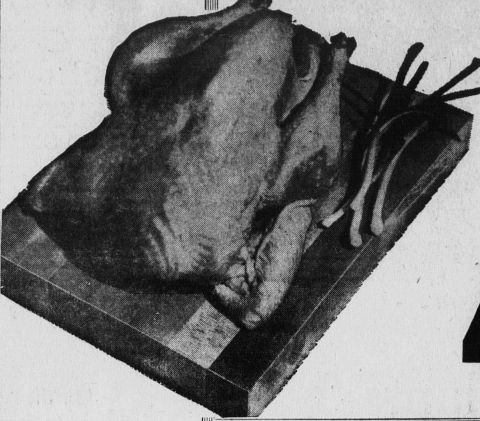
Interment was in Little Sands Cemetery.

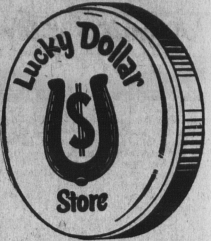
