Steel Demand Seen Strong Rest Of Year

CLEVELAND (AP) — Steel magazine said Sunday demand for steel the rest of this year may top expectations.
The trade publication based the forecast on anticipation of strong demand from the auto industry, where sales continue brisk and high level of activity in the construction industry.
"The tremendous momentum that has built up in business activity is still not fully recognized," Steel said, "but it is bound to show up in increased orders for steel."
"Generally, metal working avoided the summer doldrums. Factory output and new bookings during July and August were well above year-ago levels. A high level of earnings by consumers and businessmen has buoyed spending plans, particularly in the auto industry. Investment in new plant and equipment is increasing." **EXPECT SURGE**
"Even with no increase in demand, 1963 input production would total 108,000,000 tons, highest since 1957's 112,700,000 tons, Steel said. "Some people think the fourth quarter will be strong enough to push this year's input total to as much as 109,000,000 tons."
A survey by the magazine indicated reduction of inventories.

Post-Labor Day Stock Boom Stamps Year Unusual At N.Y.

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market answered the question of what kind of trend there would be after Labor Day by surging to its highest level in history last week.
The Dow Jones industrial average—the most closely watched market barometer in brokerage houses board rooms throughout the world—advanced last week to a record high, topping the 1962 peak a doing it emphatically and on heavy volume.
The rise of Dow Jones had been preceded by historic peaks in other popular market indicators — the Associated Press average of 60 stocks, which has been making new highs since April, and the broad 500-stock Standard and Poor's index, which climbed to a record two days before the Dow industrials made it.
Since the market has declined more often than it has advanced following Labor Day in past years, the week's performance has already stamped this as a most unusual year for Wall Street.
How much farther the market rise will continue, of course, is anybody's guess.
The four-day trading week—shortened by the Labor Day holiday—began optimistically amid various good reports about the economy. Steel production climbed again. New orders for factories and business were rising to a record high, topping the 1962 peak a doing it emphatically and on heavy volume.
The rise of Dow Jones had been preceded by historic peaks in other popular market indicators — the Associated Press average of 60 stocks, which has been making new highs since April, and the broad 500-stock Standard and Poor's index, which climbed to a record two days before the Dow industrials made it.
Since the market has declined more often than it has advanced following Labor Day in past years, the week's performance has already stamped this as a most unusual year for Wall Street.
The AP average advanced 2 to 229 1/2, its 61st straight weekly gain.
Volume for the week totalled 24,577,722 shares compared with 23,535,130 the previous week, a full five-day trading week.
Among most active issues, Sperry Rand was off 3/4 at 135.120 shares. Chrysler was unchanged at 72 1/2; Conrail, up 7 at 66; High Voltage Engineering, up 6 1/4 at 48 1/2; U.S. Steel, up 3/4 at 54 1/4.
On the American Stock Exchange, Felmot Petroleum was up 2 1/4 at 11 on 236,000 shares; Pancoast Petroleum, off 1/4 at 13 1/2; Syntex, up 10 1/4 at 124 1/2; Sperry Rand, unchanged at 9 1/4; and Asamera Oil, up 1/4 at 14.
