To Complete Spring Park
Sewerage System In Aug.

The green light was given to W. H. Crandall, M. Eng. C. E. engineer, and the Commissioners of Water and Sewerage at a joint special meeting of the City Council Monday evening to proceed with the installation of a 2,000-foot combination sanitary and storm sewer system connecting the Malpeque Road and the Government Pond.

The completion of the system, which is expected to be in the latter part of August, will mean that the entire area of Spring Park, now known as Ward Six, from the East side of the North River Road to the Malpeque Road will have sanitary service. Plans are being prepared by Crandall engineering to provide water for the same area and citizens there should enjoy this service by fall.
