### Will Consider Japan Joining Colombo Plan

OTTAWA, (CP)—Membership for Japan in the Colombo plan for economic aid to South and Southeast Asia may be discussed at the plan's consultative committee meeting here next month.  
An external affairs department spokesman Tuesday said this question may come under consideration but there is no plan now to invite Japan to become a member or to send an observer to the conference.  
The spokesman was commenting on a Washington dispatch which said Canada, as host country, is preparing to send Japan an invitation to the conference.  
Canada previously announced that she had invited Thailand to continue its practice of sending an observer to the committee meetings attended by representatives of India, New Zealand, Australia, Pakistan, Britain, Ceylon, Malaysia, British Borneo, Viet Nam, Laos, Cambodia, Indonesia, Nepal and Burma.  
The spokesman said Thailand has accepted the invitation and will have a representative at the Ottawa conference.  
Membership for Japan has been under discussion for some time, the spokesman said. However, it is a question which concerns all member-countries and not Canada alone.

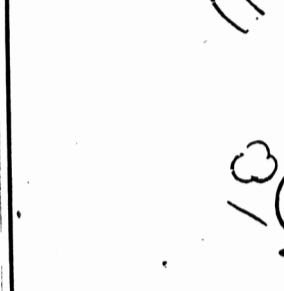
