STRENGTH FOR THE PRESENT HOPE FOR FUTURE IN GOD

One of the most difficult stages in the life of the spirit is the reaction which follows the first joy of conversion.

We remember vividly the depth and height of the happiness that took possession of the soul when the love of Christ first became a personal experience.

One's entire nature was shot through with a brightness above that of the sun, and it seemed as if all nature rejoiced with us. Prayer was a delight, Bible-reading an inspiration as if every line were written for us personally, and the worship of the sanctuary a foretaste of the songs of the redeemed in glory.

But after a short time the radiance faded: the use of the means of grace became dull and difficult; and service became a drudgery. This went on until one began to wonder if those first experiences had a real foundation after all. But still there faced us the facts that strength for the present and hope for the future were found only in God, and there was nothing for it but to set one's will to struggle through the period of difficulty to the light beyond.

In due time the clouds rolled away, "the sun of righteousness" shone again "with healing in His wings."

Years afterward we were studying Professor A.B. Bruce's exposition of Jesus' parables and came to the one which Mark alone records—the seed growing secretly or "automatically" as the Greek has it (Mark 4:26-29).

It was a very thorough theological interpretation, but suddenly we caught the ring of a genuine

personal experience. He was dealing with the Kingdom's gradual growth, "first the blade, then the ear, and then the full grain in the ear," and he applied it to the growth of religion in the soul.

It was evident that he too had been through the experience of the joy of conversion and the reaction that followed. It was also clear that he had been deeply distressed by the reaction and had been driven to question the reality behind those early ecstasies which answer to the dawning of God's love on the soul.

However, he worked his way through the gloom and this is how he illustrates the soul's "growth in grace." The joy of conversion is like the blossoms in the spring, bright and beautiful, fragrant, and commanding the admiration of all who see them.

REAL ADVANCE The blossom stage is followed, however, by the sour fruit stage, in which there is no beauty, and no fragrance, in which the acid predominates, while no one pays any attention to it. But the sour fruit stage is a real advance on the blossom stage, and it must be gone through if the rich, ripe fruit is ever to be prepared for the Master's table.

So it is in the Christian's progress. Our human nature is weak and unsteady, and the height of our early joy in the Lord will be the measure of the depth of the depression that follows. So often our environment hinders where it ought to help; temptation assails the soul whenever an opening for it appears; those on whom we depend for guidance often mistake the way.

Our Christianity is tested and proven by the earnestness with which we seek God's will in each situation and the resoluteness with which we defy our difficulties and do it.

There is no victory without conflict and those who would enter into peace must accept life's challenges, and, with Christ's help, fight the battle through.

At present there is a general expectancy of religious revival and many are seeking the way to God. The way may be hard at first, some of the most earnest souls found God only after a hard struggle.

PRAY FOR THEM

We should pray for them that they too may find the love of God dawning on their souls like the morning with all the joy it brings. But they too should be warned that their feelings are changeable as April weather and that emotion is not the faith that saves. It is the action of will that accepts Christ as Saviour and commits our lives to Him as their Lord.

Our purpose to be Christ's must be a definite and final commitment of ourselves to Him. There must be no looking back; Christ can and will help but only when, without any reservation, we place our lives in His hands. In all the parables of the kingdom we note the certainty of the consummation "when the grain is ripe, at once He puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come."

To change the figure, the race of life is toward a certain goal. The voyage of the soul is toward a particular port. We are not drifting aimlessly on a shoreless sea. In His parables dealing with the last things Jesus taught His disciples that He was going to leave them and would be away for a long time, but that His return was certain.

When he does return, He will require an account of our use of all that He has entrusted to us. Our ability and reliability in His service will be tested and proven in the long delay, so that per-
