NEW YORK, Aug. 22 (AP)—New York Giants today announced they had purchased pitcher Alex Konikowski, 23-year-old right-hander, from their Ottawa farm club in the International League. He will report here Friday. Konikowski has been in the Giants organization since 1944 and

had a brief trial with the parent club in 1948. At Ottawa this year he won eight while losing seven. Five of his victories were shutouts.

Jesse Owens Gets Belated Ovation in Berlin

BERLIN, Aug. 22 (AP)—Jesse Owens returned today to the scene of his 1936 Olympic triumphs and received a thundering ovation 15 years overdue.

A crowd of 75,000 piled into Olympic Stadium, the huge arena that Adolf Hitler built, and roared a salute to the balding Negro athlete whom Hitler refused to recognize after he had won four Olympic Gold Medals.

Jesse responded with a touching speech in which he adjured all Germans to "stand fast with us in the fight for freedom and democracy, under the protection of Almighty God."

When Owens had finished the acting mayor of free West Berlin, Walter Schreiber, came up to congratulate him.

"Hitler wouldn't shake your hand," the mayor said into the microphone. "I give you both hands."

The crowd roared. Owens' appearance was just part of a mammoth show arranged by the U. S. high commission and the U. S. army.

The former Ohio State star came on between halves of a basketball game and stood before the vast crowd including many thousands from the soviet-occupied east, stripped down to a track suit.

Measuring every word, he said: "Words often fail on occasions like this. But I remember the good that happened here. I remember the fighting spirit and sportsmanship shown by German athletes on this field, especially by Lutz Long of Germany, the man I managed to beat in the broad jump on my last jump."

"Hitler stood right up there in the box. But I believe the real spirit of Germany, a great nation, was exemplified down here on the field by athletes like Long."

LONDON, Aug. 22 (AP)—The Board of Trade has permitted a British match makers to reduce the number of matches in lieu of fractional price increases equal to six per cent on a two-penny box. The average now will be 47 matches to a box instead of 50.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 22 (AP)—Premier Alcide de Gasperi of Italy has accepted an invitation to visit the United States in September for talks with President Truman and State Secretary Dean Acheson, Acheson said at a press conference today.

The Italian appeal for revision of Italy's peace treaty probably will come up during the talks.
