HUNTER'S CORNER

Trout Fishing Perked Up Since Early In August

The month of July 1963 will, in all probability, go down on trout fishermen's records as the poorest troutting month on record. It was hot and dry. The only rain we had worth mentioning was on July 3rd, 4th and 5th and for the balance of the month barely enough rain when it did come, to settle the dust. Trout fishing, however, has perked up sharply after the first week in August. Sea trout has begun moving freely after the 10th of the month and some good catches have been made since that date. They are not running large and seldom exceed the three quarter pound bracket but are going to be in good luck under a limit (20) of silver sheen trout in the half and three quarter pound class. I had planned on getting caught up on my trout fishing this season but on July 9th received a call to supervise dam repair and construction work and haven't set a line since.

I should have made my while the sun was going to heat the trips out for trout in May and in July. I never set a line on two trips. May for less wind swung East about the time I got my fishing rod assembled. I should have planned on my first trout sock but here goes: May 14th - 8 fish - 2 1/2, 2nd, 8, and 8 1/2 - a total of 37. Several hit the pound and a quarter bracket. I released under 8 inches in length except one that was hooked heavy and suffered damage to its gills. Once a trout's breathing apparatus is injured one might as well place it in the freezer - it had the courtesy.

WELL PATRONIZED

Departmental dams, those constructed for public angling in the major rivers, are well patronized this season. A dam hasn't to be large to supply top notch fishing. I was told this week he counted 4 anglers at the Brazil Dam, Johnston who patronize it. The Larkin Dam, which has produced thousands of trout this season, is also well patronized. It holds the record. It backs water up close to two and one half miles. Some of the best trouting water is above the railroad bridge. Most of the trout fishermen who patronize it is a dam use outboard motors as motive power - a long, hard paddle otherwise. The Cornwall Dam, St. Peter's district is the largest body of water in the province. It backs water up for a distance of an approximate three miles and floods an immense area of former meadow and alder tangles wherein many heavy springs are located. Watch it boys. If you paddle up too far and wander off the main creek channel you could be there all night or longer than that. Even students of the area get lost at times. It's easy to lose the creek channel when you come to the odd beaver dams or natural wild meadows that have been buried under several feet of water. One large beaver dam a mile upstream was covered over by its embankment and the beaver had to construct a new one or else another storey to the one they had.

I have received information that some trout fishermen are endeavouring to catch up on fishing time lost in July, when trout were in an uncooperative mood, and have resorted to using two rods. The upper rod, which is the North River Causeway is reported to be the "hot spot" for this illegal practice. I've been told that it is nothing unusual to see two anglers in a boat with four rods in action, two active and two inactive but in action nevertheless. The Vernon River Causeway is not so well patronized by anglers as the one at North River. The Vernon is shy on springs and the water warms up during July and August and affects the flavor and quality of it's trout. In short it's trout are about as flat and tasteless as a platter as it is possible to be without having to be frozen in-

TOURIST TO KELLY?

TORONTO (CP) - Red Kelly, the hockey - playing Liberal member of Parliament for York West, indicated Wednesday that unless he receives special privileges from Toronto Maple Leafs, his hockey days are over.

Kelly, speaking here at a Liberal "nomination" meeting for Toronto's new provincial riding of Lakeshore, said he was not sure whether he and his family could stand the pace of last year.

"There is a possibility I might not play unless some concessions are made," he said. He said the concessions would deal mainly with the number of hockey practice sessions a week.

Kelly said it was difficult to expect him to commute several times a week between Ottawa and Toronto to attend hockey games and practices while Parliament is in session.

Kelly admitted he had not signed a 1963-64 contract with the Leafs. He said he would see Leaf manager-coach Punch Imlach later this week to discuss the matter.

GOET LOCOMOTIVE

MONTREAL (CP) - A British locomotive built in 1953 is to arrive by ship in Montreal Sept. 2, destined for the Canadian Railroad Historical Association's museum at nearby Delson. The locomotive weighing about 25 tons bears the name Waddon and is a gift to the CRHA from British Railways. When retired last December it had completed 87 years of continuous service.
