Cultivation should be thorough enough to control weeds. Heavy soils will absorb more water if they are kept loosened by cultivation.

When the asparagus brush is removed in the fall it should be cut too early, as it has been shown by monthly chemical analysis that plant food materials continue to be translocated from the tops to the storage roots until the tops are almost dead.
