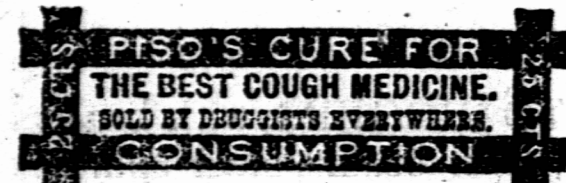
Be sure and mark an **X** opposite the words "Against the Petition," and don't put any other mark on the ballot else the vote will be void, and the ballot thrown away.

A Peddler's Presence of Mind.

The peddler being a respectable sort of man, was finally allowed to remain, and retired to the small chamber. Shortly after midnight a rap was heard at the entrance of the house, and the girl, thinking it might be her father and brother returned, arose and opened it. Two men suddenly appeared in the darkness and demanded all the money in the house. The poor girl was too frightened to scream, and trembling went to a cupboard containing \$30, which she handed to the intruders. She was then commanded to "go upstairs and get the rest," the men stating they knew her father and brother were not at home and she was alone. The girl then went upstairs and while pretending to search quietly unlocked the door of the peddler's chamber and whispered to him that there were thieves downstairs. Procuring a loaded revolver from his pack, he gave the girl some money in bills, and told her to go down and hand it to the intruders. She did so, and as one of them was reaching out for it, the peddler fired, wounding the fellow in the shoulder. His companion, who was behind, was also fired at, and wounded in the leg. With oaths both turned out and fled. The fellow who had been given the thirty dollars at first dropped it the moment he was shot. A trail of blood, which finally became lost in the snow, was observed for a couple of acres leading from the house next morning.—*Ontario Free Press.*

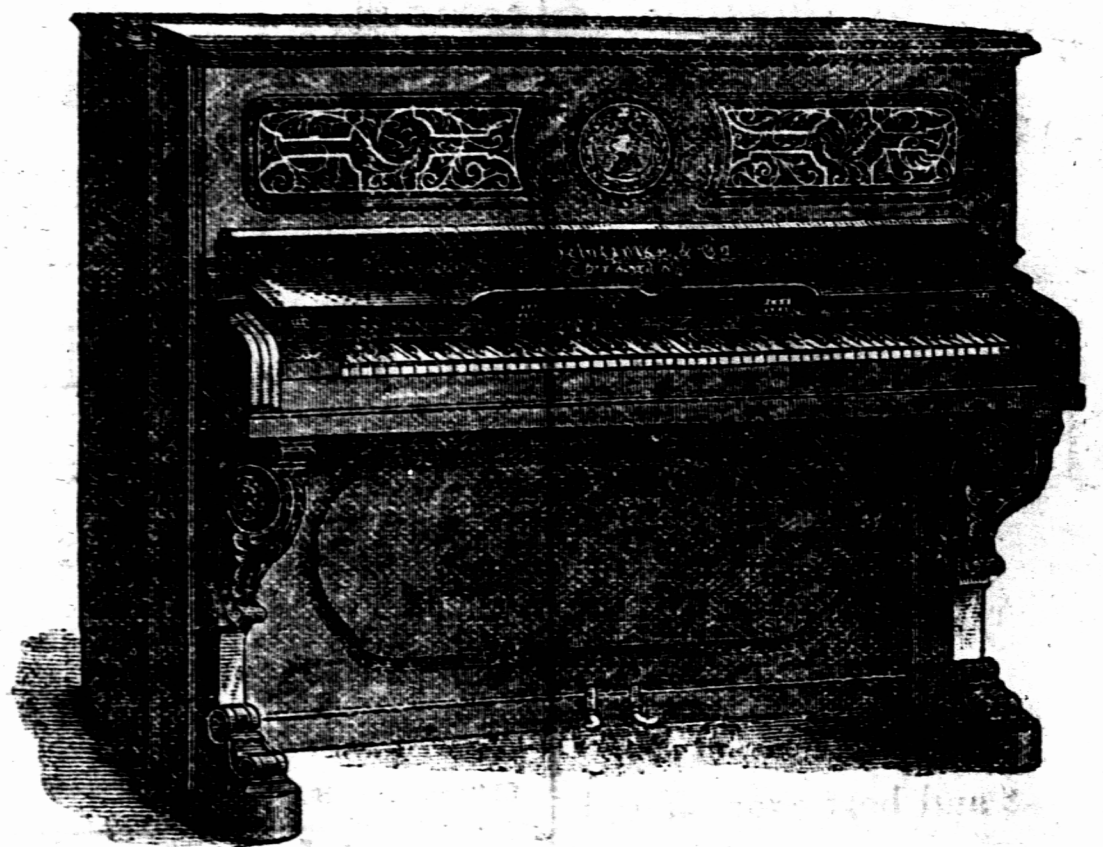
