accordance with the provisions of the Canada Elections Act I forwarded my resignation as a member of this House. ...Previous to fulfilling this requirement I checked the Rules of Procedure of this Assembly, the Election Act of the Province of Prince Edward Island and the Federal General Election Instructions and could find no indication as to any particular method or procedure to be followed. In addition, I inquired from a number of people and they did not know of any special form that was needed. "Under the circumstances it was naturally concluded that a simple clear statement of intent to resign, duly signed by myself and forwarded to the Speaker, would be sufficient. This was done in absolute good faith and I had no knowledge of the existence of a

minor technicality, that my resignation should be witnessed by two persons, such as was later found in the Legislative Assembly Act. ...The Federal Election Act was duly and validly contested by myself and on August 13th a by-election writ was issued to fill the vacancy caused by my resignation. A few days later the writ was rescinded and the seat declared not vacated—a decision over which I have no control and which I am obliged to accept. "I am making this statement due to the considerable discussion that has taken place in the Press to affirm again that I acted in all good faith in this matter and fulfilled my duties to the best of my knowledge at the time.
