

### Charlottetown Youth, 16 Gets Suspended Sentence

A two-year suspended sentence was imposed on Gerald MacDonald, 16, of Charlottetown in city police court Saturday by Magistrate A. J. Haslam, QC.

The youth, who pleaded guilty to theft of a bicycle, was ordered to make restitution to the sum of \$88.50. He was also ordered to enter into recognizance a bond of \$500 with the sureties of \$250 each and to be home between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.

The accused was remanded to Sept. 15 on a charge of theft of less than \$50.

Eugene Joseph Gallant, Charlottetown, charged with attempted theft had the charge withdrawn. He was represented by Gordon Tweedy.

Paul T. Croken of Charlottetown was charged with speeding.

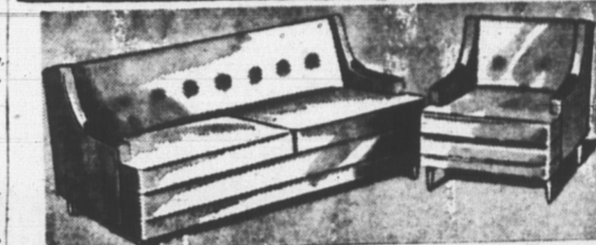

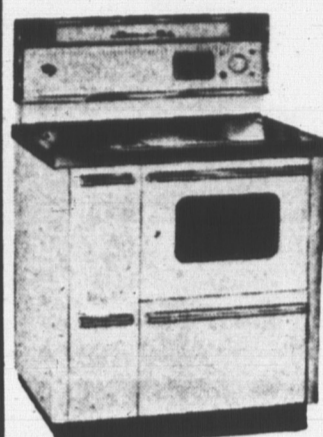

## Fall Teachers' Convention Is Held By Tignish Local

**TIGNISH** - The 1965 convention of the Tignish Local of the P.E.I. Teachers' Federation was held at the Tignish Regional High School Friday with 82 teachers in attendance.

The convention was opened at 9 o'clock with Aubin J. Gallant presiding. The secretary Paul Batchelder, read the minutes of the 1964 convention that were adopted.

Following the minutes Mr. Gallant addressed the convention. He chose as his subject "How to make the school day more interesting and challenging." He said teachers should strive to secure and maintain interest in the classroom. Each teacher should have his objectives and make an effort to develop enthusiasm for work and make pupils realize that they too have something to contribute.

The general secretary of the Teachers' Federation for the province, Ann Riley, then gave her report. She dealt with teachers' salaries pensions and the affiliations of the P.E.I. TP with other educational bodies throughout Canada.

Miss Riley also spoke on teacher research and stated that experimentation was now being done along these lines. She thanked the teachers for their past co-operation.

**CHALLENGING JOB** - Albert J. Gallant, superintendent of schools for the area then addressed the gathering, welcoming the teachers, especially new one and those returning to the profession.

Mr. Gallant said the teacher's job was a challenge for the teacher's whole career. "We must keep abreast with all new developments." He said teachers have less and less time to do more and more work. He outlined the tremendous amount of work a teacher had to undertake.

Mr. Gallant also spoke on curriculum, mentioning in particular the strides being taken in science and mathematics. "We must rely on study and experimentation on the class level to teach these subjects. A critical eye is needed by well qualified and experienced teachers," he said.

Election to the board of governors then followed resulting in Rev. Sister St. Mary Arnold, Paul Batchelder and Mrs. Anthony Doucette being elected as the new members to represent the local.

**CHANGES OUTLINED** - Following a short break J.A.S. Williams, director of curriculum and licensing from the department of education, then outlined the many changes which have taken place and those which are to come. Mr. Williams enlightened the teachers on different phases of the curriculum and presented his views as to why committees had recommended and made certain changes in text books.

Mr. Williams also spoke briefly on examinations, workshops and licensing of teachers.

Christopher Geldhill, director of music for Island schools, then told the teachers he would be available to visit their schools if they so requested.

In the afternoon session Ross Wilson superintendent for regional high schools, invited the high school teachers to a special gathering to discuss high school problems while the elementary teachers were given a short instruction regarding the teaching of music and how teachers can initiate the teaching of singing in the rural schools, so that teachers can prepare pupils to come into high schools with some musical background.

A sing-song was held under the direction of Sister St. George music teacher for Tignish schools, and Mrs. Diamond, music teacher for the Alberton schools.

The program then continued with a talk on the importance of the Red Cross in schools, and the work the Red Cross has been doing by Mrs. W. W. Reid, director.

In a letter to the department of education, which sponsored part of the visit, Mr. Kitson said the program planned for the students "could not have been better."

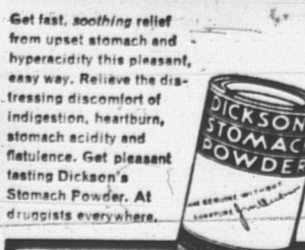
Particularly enjoyed by the Prairie visitors were the beach parties, deep sea fishing and attending a performance of "Ann of Green Gables" in Charlottetown.
