MAJOR EXHIBITION OF WAR ART NOW ON DISPLAY IN GALLERY

A major exhibition of war art by internationally acclaimed artist, Alex Colville, is currently on display at Confederation Centre Art Gallery and Museum in Charlottetown.

Famous today as a painter of the "realist" school, Alex Colville's talents are recognized throughout Europe and North America. During his career as official war artist, he completed 126 works, including sketches, watercolors and oil paintings. These are now part of the Canadian War Museum's War Art Collection.

Although examples of this painters' war work have appeared in other displays Alex Colville: War Artist is the first major show of the work from this painter's war period. The exhibition incorporates forty painting, all showing overseas scenes and activities of the Canadian army, navy, and air force. The works are arranged chronologically, so the visitor travels with Colville from Britain to Corsica, to the Netherlands, and so on through Germany, culminating in the horror of Belsen.

Alex Colville: War Artist will remain on view at Confed. Centre Art Gallery until Sunday, March 14.
