PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

Crows' Nest Pass Railway.

\$15,000,000 TO BE ADDED TO THE PUBLIC DEBT,

Supplementary Estimates Show Nothing for the Belfast and Murray Harbor Railway.

OTTAWA, June 19.—The Crows' Nest Pass Railway subsidy was considered in committee of the whole House yesterday. Hon. Mr. Blair spoke for an hour and a half, closing with a panegyric on British Columbia, his visit to which had, he said, made him prouder of Canada than he had ever been before. He spoke at times with almost hysterical fervor, but was heard by his followers in dead silence, except for a slight round of cheers when he said that he was proud of Canada, in concluding his vigorous speech.

Sir Charles Tupper argued that the proposed contract would cost the country \$6,000 a mile or in all nearly \$3,000,000 more than the late Government proposed to pay. He did not value as high as the Ministers seemed to do, the great concessions that the country was supposed to have obtained from the Canadian Pacific Railway. However, he would be willing to assume that the Government had made what the Ministers thought was the best bargain and he would not oppose the proposition.

The party whips are pairing members and allowing them to go home. But the Senators are expected to be here all next week. They are not saying much; but it is not likely that they will efface themselves by swallowing everything that is sent to them without examination or criticism. It need not surprise the public too much if the Intercolonial extension to Montreal gets the hoist.

The Finance minister gave notice yesterday of a generous borrowing scheme. He talks authority to make loan of not more than \$15,000,000 in addition to sums already authorized but not yet borrowed. The maximum interest is to be four per cent.

The supplementary estimates for next year were brought down at 1.30 this morning. The total amount to be voted is \$1,360,215. Five thousand dollars are to be paid as gratuities to penitentiary officials to be retired. For P. E. Island one thousand dollars are given Lewis (?) Point pier; five thousand for the purchase of creosoted piles for general repairs to the wharves; seven hundred and fifty dollars to St. Stephen pier; five hundred dollars to Rustico.

The sum of \$11,843 are asked for the purchase of three wharves on the Hillsborough River from Provincial Government; \$2,510 are asked for an old claim for carrying the Newfoundland mail.

PLACE DE LA CONCORDE.

The Most Famous and Beautiful Square in Gay and Vivacious Paris.

The most important public square in Paris and one of the handsomest in the whole world is the Place de la Concorde. In the center rises the obelisk of Luxor, presented by the pasha of Egypt to Louis Philippe. It is flanked on either side by a large fountain. The Place de la Concorde seems somewhat wrongly called, in view of the history of the spot. One hundred and fifty years ago it was an open field, but in 1748 the city accepted the gracious permission of Louis XV to erect a statue to him here. The place then took his name and retained it till the new regime, in 1789, melted down the statue and converted it into 2 cent pieces.

On the 30th of May, 1770, during an exhibition of fireworks here, a panic took place and 1,200 people were trampled to death and 2,000 more were severely injured. The occasion was the attempt of the people to express by a grand celebration their unbounded joy at the recent marriage of the young dauphin with the Austrian princess Marie Antoinette. On the 21st of January, 1793, they gathered here again in immense numbers to see the head of the same dauphin, then Louis XVI, chopped off by the sharp guillotine. During the next two years the spot well earned its title "Place of the Revolution," for the guillotine had not ceased its work until Marie Antoinette, Charlotte Corday, M^{me}. Elizabeth (the king's sister), Robespierre and more than 2,800 persons had here perished by its deadly stroke.—Chautauquan.
