

# N. B. Golfer Sets Pace With Sub Par Round

## Tommy Stewart Fires A Hot '9 To Lead Field For Two Province Title

Tommy Stewart of St. Croix, New Brunswick, a former N. B. P.E.I. amateur golf champion, fired a brilliant 69 over the Charlotte-town Golf Course yesterday to lead a field of 164 golfers in the annual N. B. - P.E.I. amateur and open tournament.

Stewart has a two day score of 147, three strokes more than runner-up Bob Gray of Charlottetown who shot a 76 yesterday.

Playing under a downpour of rain the long ball-hitting Stewart shot a 34 over the first nine and a 35 on the back nine as he toured the course three strokes under par in a record-equalling performance. Only twice has a score of 69 been carded at the local course in tournament play.

Art MacKenzie of Charlottetown fired a red-hot 74 to move into a third-place tie with defending champion Pete Kelly of Fredericton. Both players have a total score of 152. The steady Kelly fired a 76 yesterday.

Had McInnis of Charlottetown come up with a fine 75 and Bill Beer of Charlottetown with a 76 to move into a fourth place tie with F. Mavor of Edmundston with scores of 153. McInnis has a net score of 141 to lead the golfers in this department.

Jerry Fitzpatrick of Saint John, who led the field after Monday's round, dropped to fifth place with a score of 154. He shot an 81 yesterday.

Stewart, who won the amateur crown in 1951 and who has been a member of Willingdon Cup teams

for the past two years, had four birdies and thirteen pars yesterday. He had birdies on the sixth, eighth, fourteenth and sixteenth holes.

The St. Croix lumber man, who plays in Maine State tournaments, is no stranger to the local course. He played here considerably when he was stationed at the Air Station during 1942.

And another St. Croix man, professional Gene McNabb continued his pace-setting among the pros. McNabb came up with a 73 yesterday to lead the ten professionals with a two-day score of 148.

Archie Skinner of Saint Andrew's is second with 154 after his round of 75 yesterday. Tied for third place are Cecil Dowling of Charlottetown and Alan Ogilvie of Moncton with 155.

Dowling shot a 77 yesterday. He had four pars on the first nine and six pars and a birdie on the last nine.

The tournament will conclude today. All golfers will play eighteen holes and this afternoon the professionals along with the eighteen leading amateurs will play another round to decide the Open Championship.

Bob Gray shot a 38 on each nine yesterday as he remained in second place. He had seven pars on the first nine while he came up with two birdies and four pars on the back nine.

Art MacKenzie, who led the local players on yesterday's round, had three birdies and eleven pars. He shot a 37 on each nine. Frank McInnis had two birdies and eleven
