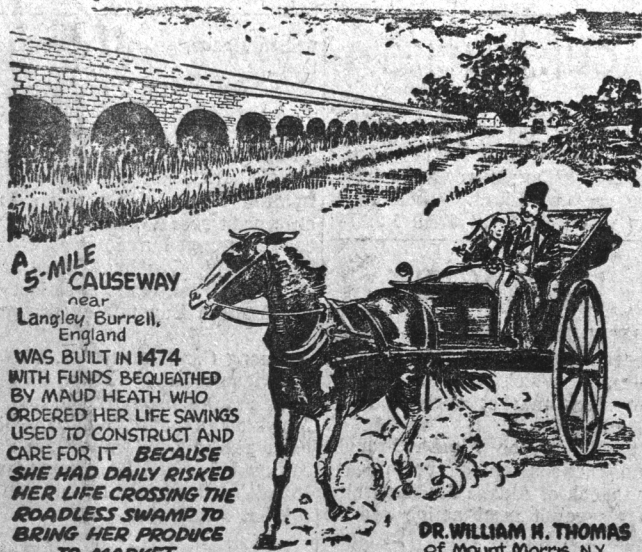

CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding: 1 South West North East 1 ♠ Pass 2 ♣ Pass 2 NT Pass 3 ♣ Pass

Opening lead—two of clubs. Here is a hand that contains magnificent defensive play. It illustrates how precise reasoning and foresight can overcome the difficulties and uncertainties of defense. South's first two bids and North's two club responses require no comment. Over the two notrump bid, North was in no position to know whether the best contract would be spades, clubs or notrump. The three spade bid left the choice to South, who correctly decided on the major suit game.

Regular Check Resulted In Fundy Area Restrictions

HALIFAX—Recent closing of shellfish areas in the Bay of Fundy area in New Brunswick is a precaution taken by the Department of Fisheries in conjunction with the Department of National Health and Welfare to protect the public from shellfish poisoning. The restricted area includes all districts in New Brunswick skirting the Bay of Fundy from Nova Scotia to the Maine border. Islands in the bay are also restricted areas. For the past 16 years, shellfish experts of the Fisheries Research Board of Canada together with personnel of the Department of Fisheries and the national health agency have kept a constant check on shellfish areas. When samples indicate a rise in toxicity, commercial operators are advised that the areas are closed, and the areas are posted with notices warning picnickers of the danger. FEW AREAS This problem of toxic shellfish is a widespread one. It occurs in California, British Columbia, Alaska, Quebec, the Bay of Fundy and in many other parts of the world. Fortunately, in the Maritime times it is confined to the coastal areas of St. John and Charlotte counties in New Brunswick, and Digby and Annapolis counties in Nova Scotia. In the past certain areas in the latter two districts have been closed when it became necessary. There is no indication of such a need at this time. Shellfish poisoning—officially described as "paralytic shellfish poisoning" because temporary paralysis does result—results from the ingestion of a toxin present in the organs of certain shellfish. The ultimate source of toxin is an almost microscopic one-cell marine plant which forms part of the food of clams, mussels, bar clams and similar bivalve mollusks. Danger of poisoning is greatest in the summer because temperature conditions then become ideal for the growth of this marine plant (gonyaulax tamarensis). Fisheries officials warn that in areas where this plant is present in the water, all bivalve mollusks are potentially dangerous. A notable exception, however, in Maritime waters is the scallop. The adductor muscle of the scallop, the only part which is eaten, never becomes toxic. Seriousness of paralytic shellfish poisoning has been reflected by the number of persons poisoned within the last two decades despite warning notices. Last year 33 people were poisoned. Most recent deaths from shellfish poisoning have been in the Gaspé region of Quebec. Two persons died there in 1948 as a result of eating toxic clams, while two deaths occurred in 1955 from the same cause. The Department of Fisheries emphasizes there is no danger from commercial shellfish packs. Canned packs from potentially dangerous areas must be tested and certified poison-free by the laboratory of Hygiene in Ottawa before they are released for sale. A close check is kept on canning plants, and areas from which shellfish is permitted to be fished are carefully controlled.

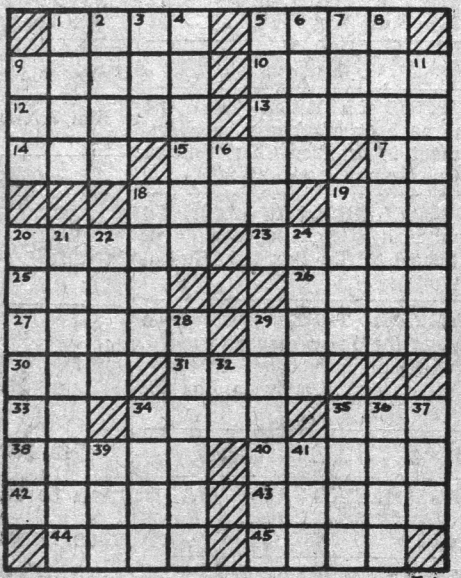
Find Bodies Of Two Constables

The body of Cpl. Herbert Smart, 33, of Toronto was found the day after the RCMP 14-foot outboard motorboat capsized during a night storm on the lake, 40 miles north of Toronto.

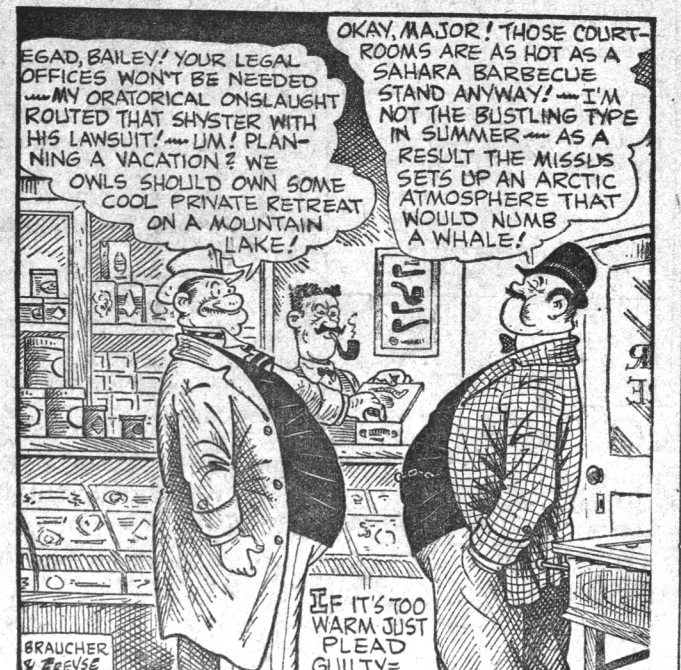

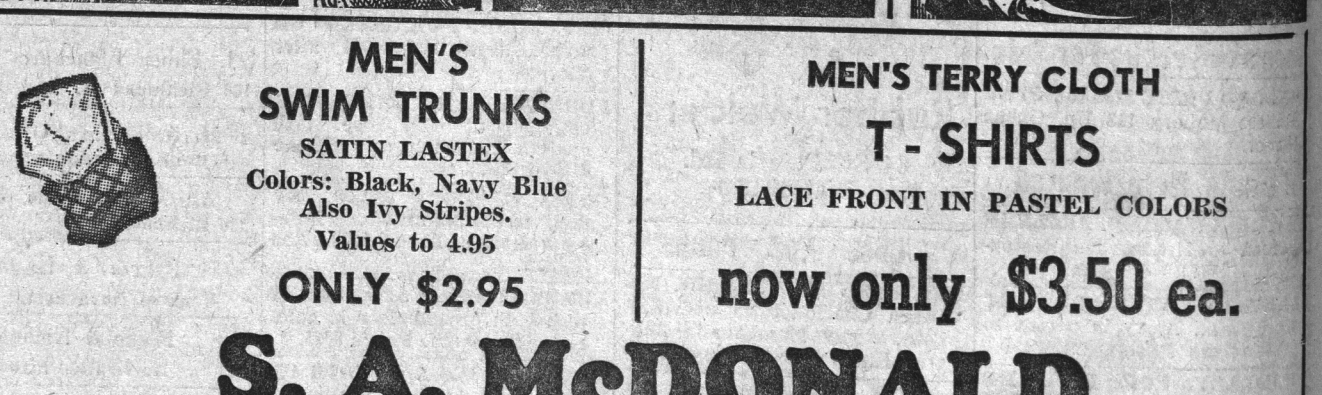
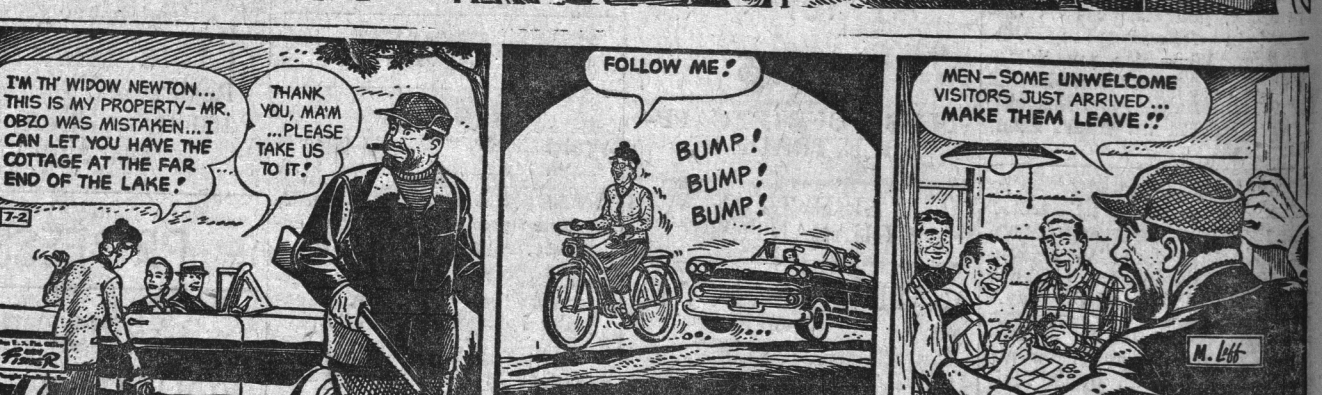
