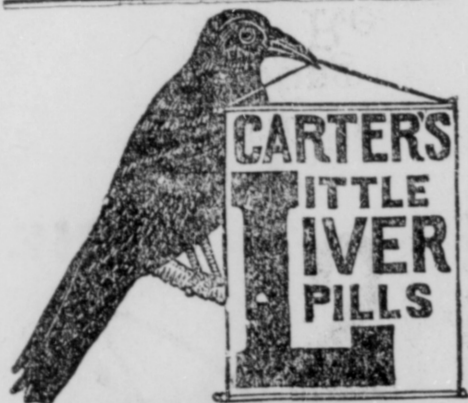

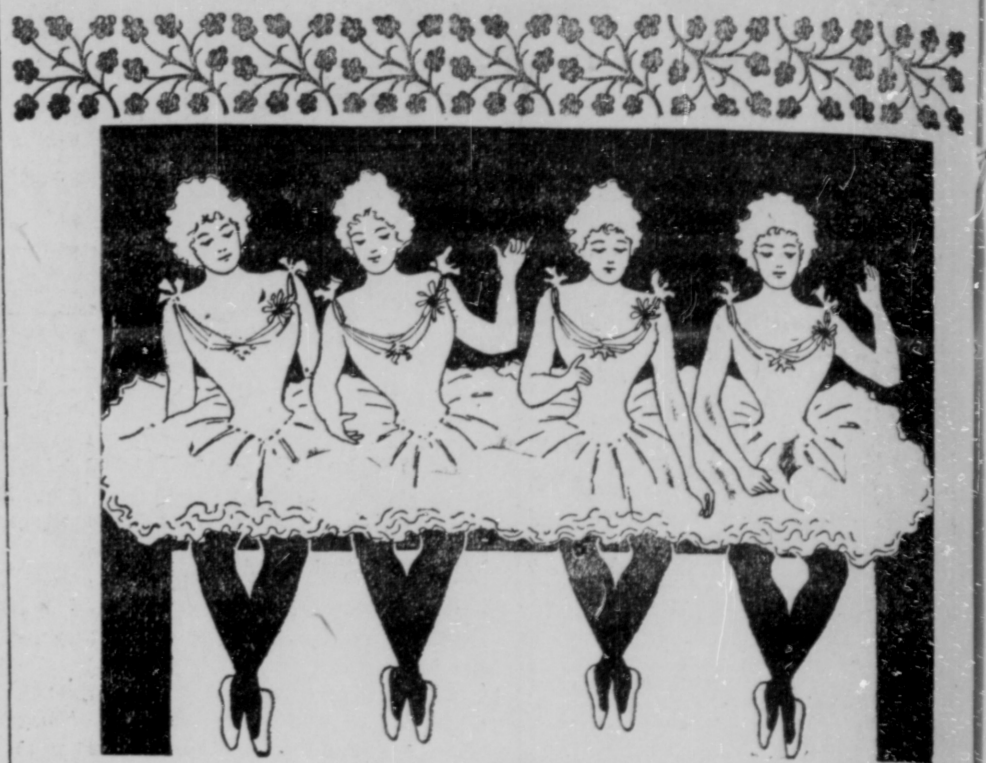
Farm For Sale
