A BATTLE FLEET OF 36 ENGLISH AND 10 FRENCH SHIPS IS INTENDED FOR OPERATIONS AGAINST SPAIN.

A battle fleet of 36 English and 10 French ships is intended for operations against Spain. Fresh negotiations for peace are said to be going on. Preparations in England for the Eastern war are still active. It is stated that in addition to the steamers already taken up, the Government will employ 1000 more.

THE NEW REFORM BILL WAS INTRODUCED INTO THE HOUSE OF COMMONS ON THE 13th INST.

The new Reform Bill was introduced into the House of Commons on the 13th inst. by Lord Russell. It is a bill for the purpose of amending the laws relating to the representation of the people.

THERE ARE 19 BOROUGHS, HAVING 300 ELECTORS UNDER, AND UNDER 5000 INHABITANTS, RETURNING MEMBERS TO PARLIAMENT.

There are 19 boroughs, having 300 electors under, and under 5000 inhabitants, returning members to Parliament. These are to be wholly disfranchised.

THE LATE MR. MCKAY'S EXPRESS HAS RESUMED THE GREAT REPUBLIC TO HER ORIGINAL BEING AND COMPLETENESS.

The late Mr. McKay's Express has resumed the Great Republic to her original being and completeness. Mr. McKay expressed his regret that his former division should have been divided into two districts, giving two members to each, and thus increasing the present representation of each county.

REKONNED, STALEY-BRIDGE AND BURLEY ARE TO BE RECONSTITUTED BOROUGHS, AND TO HAVE ONE MEMBER EACH.

DEPOSITORS HAVING NOT LESS THAN £50 IN ANY SAVINGS BANK, FOR NOT LESS THAN THREE YEARS.

Depositors having not less than £50 in any savings bank, for not less than three years. Fully, to enfranchise the working classes, and to return two members to the House of Commons.
