Four African Countries Aim At Independence

By MILTON BESSER UNITED NATIONS (AP)—Four African countries are seeking independence and membership in the United Nations before the end of this year. Others are waiting with bated breath.

The biggest of the four is Algeria, where thousands have died since Algerian Muslims launched their rebellion in November, 1954. A self-determination referendum will be held in France's North African territory Sunday but will have no legal effect as the predominantly Moslem population will no doubt vote for independence.

On that same day two new strife-torn and poverty-stricken countries will make their debut in Africa — Rwanda and Burundi. They are now the Belgian trust territory of Ruanda-Urundi.

Independence day for British-ruled Uganda has been set for Oct. 9. Admission of the four will swell the number of countries in the UN to 55—given them a majority in the General Assembly, now made up of 104 nations.

It will bring to 29 the number of countries that have gained independence in Africa since 1945. Then Egypt, Ethiopia, Guinea, Mali, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.
