Montague Medical Center Serves Wide Kings Co. Area

MONTAGUE — Kings County has made another step forward in the last few months with the erection of a new modern medical center which is situated on Main Street in Montague. The Medical Centre has been in operation since Jan. 1 of this year. This new two-story building of wooden frame, finished with wide cedar shingles, three stone panels and two large picture windows. The interior of bright modern design has four well-equipped, sound-proof offices, each with adjoining examination and treatment rooms and laboratory. There are two large waiting rooms with modern comfortable furnishings, each with a receptionist station. At present the center is housing two well known Island medical practitioners, Dr. John C. Bonnell and Dr. M. Lorne Bonnell. Dr. John C. Bonnell, who moved to Montague last fall, opened his office for the practice of medicine in the new clinic Jan. 1. He is at the clinic daily in the afternoons from 2 to 4 p.m. except Wednesday, and evenings from 7 to 9 except Monday and Friday. He holds office hours in the community of St. Peter Bay, Monday and Wednesday evenings and Wednesday afternoons, but resides in Montague next door to the center. After graduating from Dalhousie Medical School in 1960, Dr. John Bonnell practiced in Bedouque and Borden before coming to Montague. He is married to the former Catherine Craig of Middleton, P.E.I., and has two children, Elizabeth and Mary. Dr. Lorne Bonnell resides in Murray River where he has been since 1948. He is well known in this area in both medical and political circles.
