Seven Days A Week

1. Monday: A couple of time savers I read about seemed too good to keep so I am passing them along to you.—First: Put a fresh pretty hankie in the pocket of your little girl's newly ironed dress. Before hanging it away in the closet snap hair ribbon and ankle sox to match on the hanger. Colored plastic clothespins come into their own here! Second: A clean hankie can be ironed and tucked in a boy's blouse pocket too. Little boys at the ankle sock age can have their socks on the same hanger with shirts or blouses. A small pocket comb in a case would be a handy article for a youngster too.

2. Tuesday: A fashion note of fifty years ago says: "A pretty summer gown is the robe be-bedeemed of flowered taffeta, pink flowers on a white ground, trimmed with puffs of white mousseline de sole, worn over a gumpie of tulle point d'esprit. The skirt must be very full and swishy—about ten yards of material complete the dress." Another item reminds girls to keep a bunch of damp leaves in their hat for protection against the hot sun. 3. Wednesday: Ever wonder how the word "patent" came to mean legal protection for a new idea? Well, early English kings passed on practically all matters of public interest. They issued statements from foreign policy to ownership of a few acres of land. Many of these official papers were secret or "closed". Others were open to the public. Documents of the latter type were called "lettres patentes", from the French for "open letters".

A "lettre patente" was issued whenever a king conferred an honor on a subject. It was also given as a license to conduct charities, erect schools, export or import particular goods. Rulers frequently prepared one of these documents to give a subject exclusive right to make or to sell some type of merchandise.

In common speech, the title of the king's open letter was abbreviated to "patent". As more and more patents dealt with rights and privileges of inventors, the term came to stand for legal protection given a person who develops a new idea.

4. Thursday: Calvin Coolidge was once host to a prominent Englishman who ostentatiously took a British coin from his purse and remarked, "One of my ancestors was made a lord by the king whose picture you see here on this shilling."

Coolidge went into a pocket and brought forth a nickel. "One of my ancestors," he said, "was made an angel by the Indian whose picture you see on this coin."

5. Friday: Boil two pounds cod or other white fish, and be careful not to overcook it. Flake your fish into big flakes and keep it hot. Now melt 1-4 cup butter or shortening in a frying pan. In it cook one tablespoon finely minced onion to a golden color. Add 1 tsp. finely minced parsley (easily done by snipping it fine with your kitchen shears), the juice of 1-2 lemon and 1-4 tsp. pepper. Add the flaked fish next, and season with 1 tsp. salt. Shake over a medium heat until thoroughly heated through. But take care not to break the fish flakes. Serve at once, piping hot. Makes four or six servings.

6. Saturday: An invitation from a four year old went thus: "Come over to our house and see our mother cat and her kittens. The mother cat is full of little milk bottles!"

Another little lad said, "Mom, I talked him out of fighting with me; I said that the sixth grade was just coming out and my brother was in it. Then he soon went on about his business!"
