## Mrs. Evelyn Cudmore Named Carol Lane Awards Director

Appointment of a provincial director of the Carol Lane Awards of the Canadian Highway Safety Council was announced jointly by Supt. A. S. McNeil, officer commanding 14 Division, RCMP, and A. J. Galbraith, registrar of motor vehicles. Named to the post was Mrs. Evelyn Cudmore who is well known to Islanders in another field of safety, for her work with the Red Cross and other organizations in the water safety program. The Carol Lane Awards are

made to women's groups for work in promoting safety in their own community. Last year the top award of \$1,000 was won by the Marshfield women. This year there are three provincial awards for each province as well as the top award for Canada. The provincial prizes will amount to \$250, \$100 and \$50 with the award period ending in February. While the program is sponsored by the Safety Council the prizes are put up by the Shell Oil Co.

## Douglas Has Sharp Words For Marching SIU Members

OTTAWA (CP) — In a face-to-face meeting Monday New Democratic Leader J. C. Douglas told angry members of the Seafarers' International Union (SIU) that their union "long ago ceased to be a democratically-run union." One SIU member shouted at him that members of the union hadn't had any say in the government move to impose a trusteeship on the SIU and four other maritime unions. "We haven't been allowed a voice," he said. "You sure haven't — not in your union," Mr. Douglas shot back. The confrontation took place in the midst of a crowd in front of the Parliament Buildings where SIU members were protesting the trusteeship bill.

## COME FROM VANCOUVER

Mr. Douglas, accompanied by Harold Winch (NDP - Vancouver East), came out in an attempt to meet union members from his Vancouver - area constituency of Burnaby - Coquitlam. He spoke to one man from the constituency — Alfred Poole — but most of his talk was with Rod Heinekey, SIU vice-president for the west coast. Mr. Poole said he had fought against dictatorship in the Second World War and he was prepared to fight against it in front of Parliament now.

Mr. Douglas said the SIU members had "dogged" the fact that the other four unions to be put under trusteeship had accepted it. Mr. Heinekey replied that the other unions had stood back and let the SIU win the labor battles on the west coast. "You are also the people who tried to smash some of these unions by violence and intimidation," Mr. Douglas told him. The document argued the SIU's case against a government takeover and condemned the findings of Mr. Justice T. G. Morris, who proposed public trusteeship after a year-long investigation of labor strife and shipping disruptions.

**SEEK TRUSTEES**  
The move to proclaim the trusteeship measures was held back while the government lined up the three men to act as federal trustees.

Mr. Pearson told the Commons the government has been sitting in touch with three gentlemen whom we think will be very good trustees. "As soon as we hear from them we will announce it to the House."

Earlier, Transport Minister McNeil said the crews of National Harbors Board tug in Montreal were warned when they walked off that they were taking illegal action and would have to suffer all the consequences.

Under federal labor law, fines can be levied against unions, union officers or union members taking part in an illegal strike. Under the Canada Shipping Act, sailors who walk off their ships could be charged with desertion or being absent without leave.

Justice Minister Chevrier said he had received a letter from Mr. Banks contending that government trusteeship violates the Bill of Rights. "In my opinion this legislation is not inconsistent with the Bill of Rights," he said. The trusteeship would apply to the SIU, the Canadian Maritime Union, the Canadian Merchant Service Guild, the National Association of Marine Engineers and 13 marine locals of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway, Transport and General Workers.

## Early Start Planned For Sr. Housing

"If a church group, service club or a similar organization gives us land, and the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation approves the plan," said Welfare and Labor Minister Henry Weir. "The erection of homes for senior citizens will get underway this year by the Senior Citizens Housing Corporation."

He added that "since land is so valuable in Charlottetown, we plan to construct two-storey homes."

Mr. Weir said that representatives of Central Mortgage and Housing are expected to be in the province this week to consider tenders that have been called for about 30 senior citizens housing units in five communities.

**FEARS DICTATORSHIP**  
LONDON (AP)—Porbes Burnham, leader of British Guiana's opposition National Congress party, warned Monday that his homeland could become a dictatorship unless his electoral proposals are adopted. Burnham, who arrived by plane for the British Guiana constitutional conference opening here Tuesday, implied that the present electoral system was rigged against his party.
