**SUMMER IN DAWSON.**—A letter to the Toronto Globe dated Dawson, Aug. 5, says June and July have given us fair, sunny days, with all too rare showers. The highest temperature through June was 91 degrees, the lowest 31 degrees. July was warmer and more fluctuating. Dawson's maximum heat record thus far is 94 degrees, which the thermometer touched for a brief hour on July 9. It dropped by midnight for the same day to 42, a variation of 52 degrees in 24 hours. Four days in July were about 90 degrees, fifteen between 80 and 90, eight above 70 and the remainder between 60 and 70. This was the day record, of course. The drop after sundown varied between 20 and 40 degrees, and in two or three instances marked over 50 degrees.
