## Of Special Interest to our Farmers

### Does Spraying Pay.

Professor I. H. Barclay, of Cornell experiment station, in a recent bulletin, discusses the subject of spraying under this inquiry. The past season has given strange results in spraying. In many instances spraying seemed to do no good. He then goes on to say:

"Does anything pay, then? Certainly; the same as tiling and pruning do. We do not know why there were so many unsatisfactory experiences in 1898; but this does not lessen the fact that bugs and fungi should be killed. That spraying pays is as well demonstrated as it is that apple worm tent caterpillars and potato blight are injurious. Markets often fail, but it does not follow that markets are a nuisance. The safest way is to make it a rule to spray everything every year and then to break the rule when one is sure that the combination of circumstances is such that spraying is not necessary.

"This means that the fruit farmer must master the reasons and the principles and then apply them as circumstances demand. As a rule, the better the results of spraying, the better has the operator conceived of his own local problem. If the fruit-grower follows this advice, he will probably find himself spraying apples and pears and quinces every year, and he will be more than likely doing the same for plums, grapes and strawberries.

"In no one of the applications of science teaching to fruit growing has the American so clearly the advantage of the European as in the knowledge of insect and fungous pests and of means of despatching them. The superiority of the American fruit as a general market product is due in considerable degree to spraying.

### Electrical Farming.

Recent experiments in Germany and France have demonstrated that the application of electricity to the growth of crops is not only entirely practical, but profitable. It is found that the electrical current not only increases the yield about four per cent., but improves the quality of the product as well, and what is equally important, it hastens maturity. There is little doubt that electricity will ultimately work as great revolution upon the industry of farming as it has already done in transportation and lighting.

### Cabbage Worms,

Cabbage worms are certain to be with us, but they are so easily destroyed that this should not create much alarm. Take common persian insect powder, being sure to get that which is fresh, and put it into a common powder gun, or in the absence of that a pepper box with a perforated top, and early in the morning sprinkle a little of the powder over the inside of the leaves on the worms that are at work. In five minutes every worm that is touched will be dead and a few such treatments are all that is necessary in a season. The insect powder is not poisonous to anything but insects and may be used with safety.—Progressive Farmer.

That is, he breeds for eggs, "beginning with the grandmothers"—and he not only breeds for eggs, but he hatches for eggs and he feeds for eggs until, like the farmer who makes two blades of grass to grow where one grew before; the egg man makes his hen to lay two eggs where the other fellow's lays but one—or may be none at all.—Exchange.

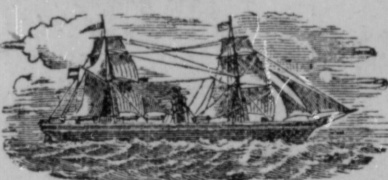
