Lee's Way C, a six-year-old brown mare owned and driven by Sid Stead captured both ends of the featured Invitational Pace at the Charlottetown Driving Park last night. The daughter of Bold Way dam Laura Doone won the fifth dash in the time of 2:09.3 and came back to win the ninth dash in a sizzling 2:06.3, the fastest time of the night.

Pays were extremely high and the purses on the fifth and ninth were no exception. Lee's Way C paid \$17.10 for a \$2 wager in race four, and returned a handsome \$13.40 to backers in the repeat dash.

Another highlight of the evening was a \$299.30 daily double pay in races eight and nine. The combination of Glamorous Wick and Lee's Way C returned this pay for a mere \$2 wager.

Sam Snead Slams Into Lead

AKRON, Ohio (AP) Sam Snead slammed into the lead with 71 for a 130 total—Edwards and Katchewan favorites Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus stumble in the second round of the Professional Golfers' Association championship.

Palmer, the 3-1 favorite, fouled an atrocious hook and an ice-cold putter around the Erie-Country Club's parched hole for a 73 leaving him nine strokes out of first place with 148. Nicklaus, Masters and British Open champion, faltered on the back nine for a 71 and a 36-hole score of 149.

The Morell Intermediates and the Legion club in the city junior league played to a 2-2 deadlock in an eight-inning exhibition game played at Memorial Field last night.

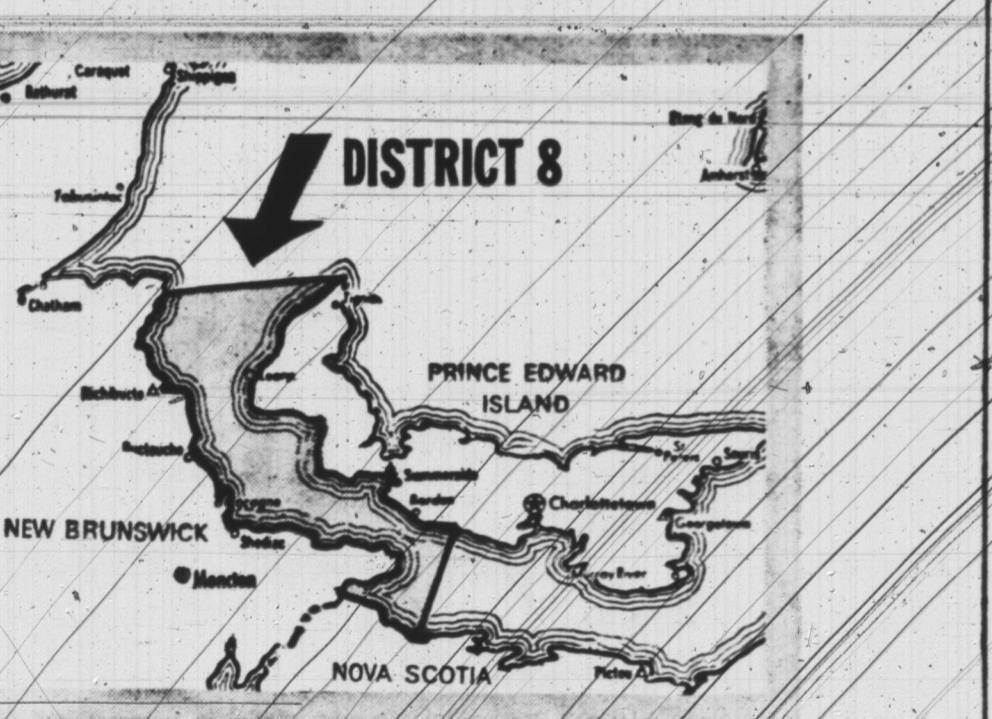
Billy Weatherbie went all the way for the Legion club and right-hander Louis Murphy also went the distance for the rural team.

To protect the future of the Atlantic Lobster Industry, the Federal Government has selected District 8 for an experimental program in trap limitation and vessel control regulations.

YOUR CO-OPERATION IS URGENTLY NEEDED. HELP PRESERVE THE LOBSTER AND PROTECT YOUR OWN FUTURE!



During the 1966 Lobster season, (August 10th to October 10th) Fishermen in District 8 will be limited to setting a maximum of 250 traps per boat.

All fishing boats above 15 tons net must be registered. Those below that tonnage may be registered voluntarily at regular fees or licensed without charge. For Department of Transport registration and licensing boat owners can contact the Registrar of Shipping at a recognized port of registry. These ports include: Charlottetown, P.E.I., Chatham and Moncton, N.B., and Pictou, N.S.
