CROSSMAN BANKRUPTCY—The first meeting of creditors was held here yesterday in the bankruptcy of William C. Crossman. Claims of creditors amount to \$2,999.10 against which there seem to be no assets except a possible interest in a house at Winsloe which was sold last month to one creditor. The Eastern Trust Company was appointed trustee with a minimum guarantee of \$150 and the following were appointed inspectors: Mr. Harry Hyndman, Macdonald-Rowe; Mr. W. E. Bentley, K. C.
