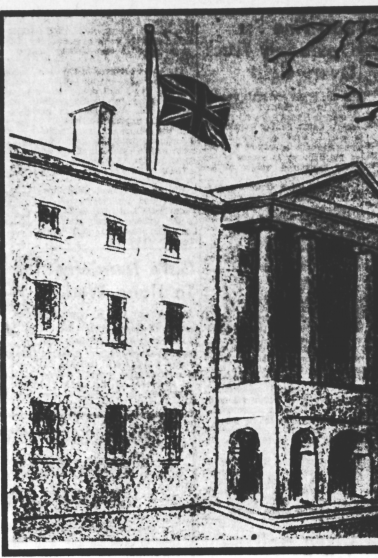

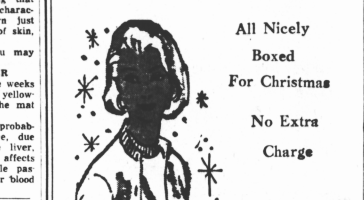
We take comfort from the fact that almost no one mentions "the snow." So passes another day in January after they have settled their leadership question...
