**AU PAYS DE L'OR**

DE RETOUR A SKAGWAY

St-Michel, 1er, via San Francisco, 28—Dix hommes épuisés de fatigue sont arrivés hier à St-Michel, après avoir fait 110 milles à pieds malgré l'orage et presque sans couvertures, pour profiter d'une occasion suprême qui leur était offerte de regagner un climat plus favorisé. Ils sont descendus dans la barge à vapeur Margaret jusqu'aux bouches glacées de l'Yukon. Ils ont traversé des rivières sur la glace qui menaçait de céder. Maintenant le temps s'est adouci dans la pluie et le thermomètre est au-dessous du point de congélation On dirait que la glace qui couvre le fleuve à son embouchure va céder et que les navires vont pouvoir le remonter.

John F. Miller, ancien attorney de district dans Washington et neveu d'un sénateur de Californie, fit le récit suivant du voyage.

"Nous étions partis avec quelques couvertures et assez de provisions pour nous rendre. Bientôt il nous a fallu marcher sur la glace, nous étions souvent obligés de nous glisser sur le ventre et pousser nos couvertures devant nous, car la glace craquait d'une façon menaçante et nous étions toujours près de voir céder cette mince couche solide qui nous séparait de la mort.

"La première nuit nous avons dormi dans une cabane d'Esquimaux abandonnée. Les souris trottaient sur nous. Il n'était guère possible de dormir.

"Nous avons passé la seconde nuit dans une maison d'hiver abandonnée. On ne peut dire toute l'horreur de cet endroit. Je ne croyais pas, je n'avais jamais rêvé que des êtres humains puissent dormir dans une semblable maison. Nous étions sept de notre troupe et dix sauvages tous entassés dans ce logis souterrain, sans un souffle d'air pur. Je sais maintenant ce que le "trou noir" de Calcutta pouvait être pour ceux que Surajah Dowlan y avait fait jeter.

"Nous en avions assez de ces sortes de gîtes. La nuit suivante, nous avons choisi la belle étoile. Le temps était aux orages et le froid très vif. Le jour suivant, quelques-uns d'entre nous sont montés sur une montagne et ont aperçu St-Michel en pleine vue. Ça été là une des plus grande joies que j'aie eues. Depuis vingt-quatre heures, nous n'avions à manger qu'un peu de bacon. Quand après avoir marché quelque temps nous avons trouvé le cadavre d'une

indienne à côté du chemin, nous avons senti un frisson nous secouer tous. Maintenant que je suis arrivé ici, avec l'expérience que j'ai acquise, je ne voudrai jamais retourner."

HOW TO SELECT A PATENT ATTORNEY
