Opening lead—king of spades. When declarer is faced with an immediate danger, he must either meet it directly, or, at the very least, attempt to minimize it if the danger cannot be completely averted. West led the king of spades against the four heart contract. South won with the ace and returned a spade, intending to ruff his third spade in dummy. East had played the five and then the three on the spade leads, thus showing a doubleton by means of the high-low. So when West took the queen of spades and continued with the ten, South realized that if he ruffed low in dummy East might be

Canadian Customs Criticized By Halifax Commons Member

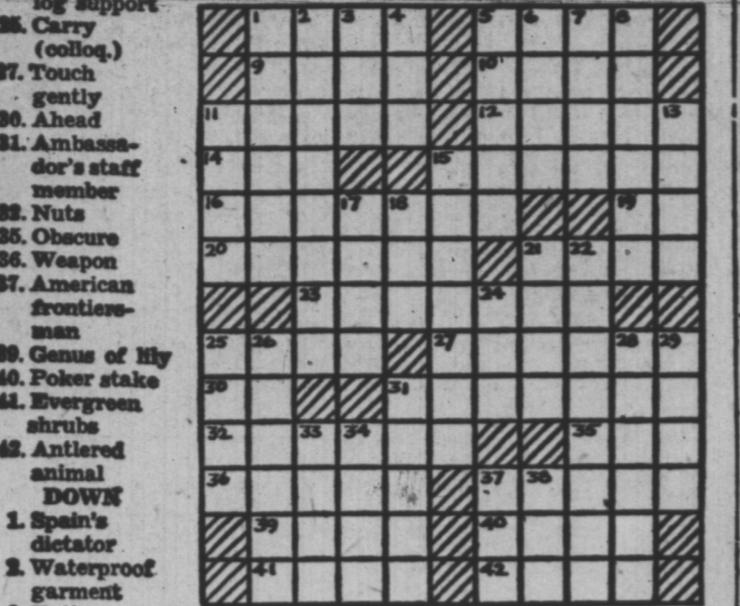
OTTAWA (CP)—The Canadian customs Tuesday was the subject of sharp criticism in the Commons estimates committee. Edmund Morris (PC—Halifax) tangled with David Sim, deputy minister of national revenue for customs and excise, over the \$5 fee charged against commercial importers at border points during weekends. Mr. Morris said Canadians were being impeded from doing business because of the hours set by the government. Government administration should conform to the wishes of the public and not the public to government administration. Mr. Morris said the \$5 penalty goes beyond the intent of Parliament and supplants legislation by administrative order. If the revenue department was going over the head of Parliament, the matter should be explored further.

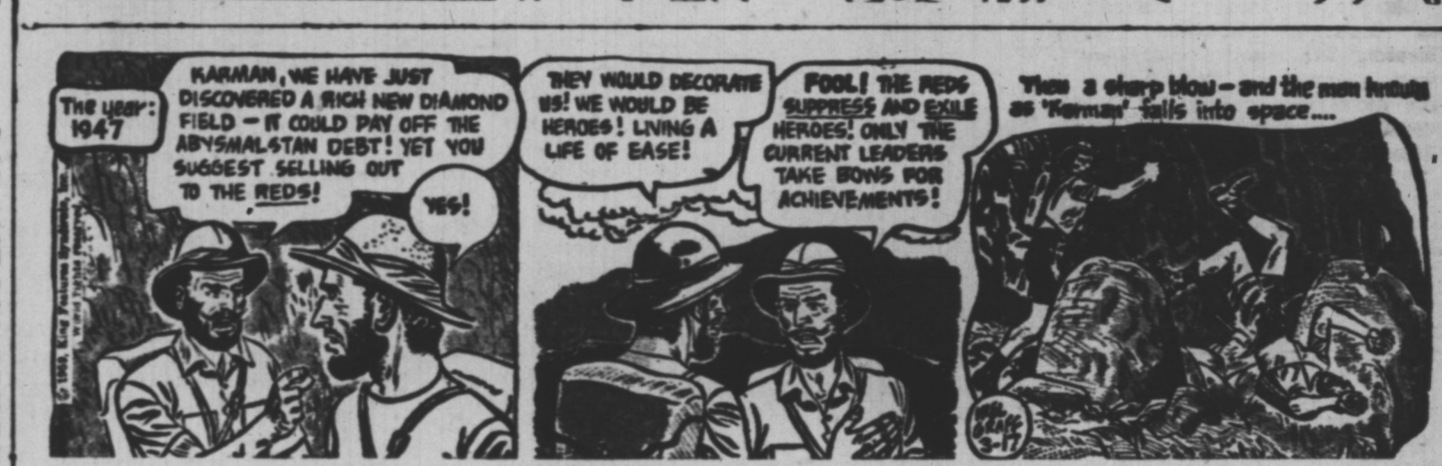
