FRENCH POLICY.

A SUDDEN and unexpected change in the foreign policy of the French politicians has been noted. The gentlemen at the head of affairs in France have apparently set themselves to show how very agreeable they can be to France's neighbors. They have lately, after years of humbugging, concluded a commercial treaty with Italy. More than that the treaty is greatly to Italy's advantage. It substitutes a friendly understanding for the former state of friction between the two nations, and it demonstrates that France has at last been forced by the march of events to cultivate friendly relations with her neighbors. A London correspondent remarks that "the French statesmen seem to be arriving at the conclusion that the policy of administering 'pin-pricks' wherever possible, which they have so long been pursuing, is disadvantageous in every respect." This irritating aggression on the part of France has alienated not only all Europe, but her former friends beyond the Atlantic as well. The Fashoda incident has helped materially to open the eyes of the French, for they found England's aggressive stand was favored by practically all Europe. Whether it was from fear of the consequences of resistance or from friendliness to Great Britain, the fact remains that no continental voice was uplifted on France's side. The discovery, too, of the essential hollowness of Russia's protestations of friendship doubtless tended to the same result. Clearly it is to the advantage of France to adopt a new policy and to abandon her senseless enmity toward her neighbors, particularly toward Great Britain. It is possible that the French politicians are merely biding the time when they can strike at Great Britain with more effect than they can under existing conditions. In any case the wisdom of the change of policy is apparent.

Heinrich Heine's sister, Frau Charlotte von Embden, has just celebrated her ninety-ninth birthday. The Emperor of Austria, remembering the Empress Elizabeth's admiration of Heine, sent Frau von Embden a letter, a picture of the murdered Empress and returned the letters of Heine presented to his wife ten years ago by the poet's sister.

A dispensation has been granted by the Holy Inquisition permitting the wives of Italian soldiers reported missing after the battle of Adua, three years ago, to marry again, "in view of the special circumstances and of the valid presumption of death." There will be lively times when the Italian Enoch Ardens return.

They are discovering in England that Uncle Sam's "open-door" in the Philippines is to Spain only, and that it is granted merely during the term of the military occupation.

Mail and Empire: The present Government was opposed when out of office to the appointment of members of the Commons to situations. It said the process was corrupt and must be stopped. In two years it has chosen from the floor of the House eleven members for places—one for a Governorship, four for the bench, and two to departmental positions.

THE FUTURE OF CHINA.

An American View.

Writing for the Engineering Magazine, Charles Denby and E. P. Allan express the opinion that there is not much probability of a partition of China. Germany, Russia, France, and England have, the point out seized what they want of the territory of China. They recognize that the greatest market on earth for their manufactured goods, and the greatest field for industrial enterprise. They have no interest in dividing her up into hostile camps, in checking production, and paralyzing progress. The more the China man is civilized, the greater purchaser of imported goods he becomes. If every man in China wore a shirt, the sale of shirtings would keep all the mills in the United States busy; and so with other articles. Nations are governed by self-interest. It is the interest of the world to preserve the autonomy of China. It is particularly to American interests to do so. To carry out this view the United States need only hold the Philippines, which they claim as their own by conquest, and they do not need to take any part of the mainland of China.

Famine and Pest.

Russia is at the present moment moment threatened with a double danger—famine and the pest, or plague. The famine will fortunately be localized in the districts of the Volga. Already the provincial authorities are doing their best to fight against, or at least to attenuate the effects of the famine. Large provisions of wheat, sent from Siberia, are being distributed among the starving families. All able-bodied peasants have been enlisted by the government authorities to labor on public buildings and other works of public usefulness. The government has also decided to employ a number of these peasants on the construction of new canals throughout the steppes, for the purposes of irrigation, since the bad harvests of the past few years are precisely the result of the barrenness of the soil. But, whereas the famine only interests Russia, and in reality, but a small portion of the empire, on the other hand the plague interests all Europe. This dread disease prevails in the province of Lamarcande, in Turkestan. It was in the village of Anzob, County of Iskender, and district of Piandjekend, that the disease suddenly made its appearance. This region is a wild one; mountainous, difficult of access and surrounded by peaks which, in certain cases, are over 13,000 feet in height.

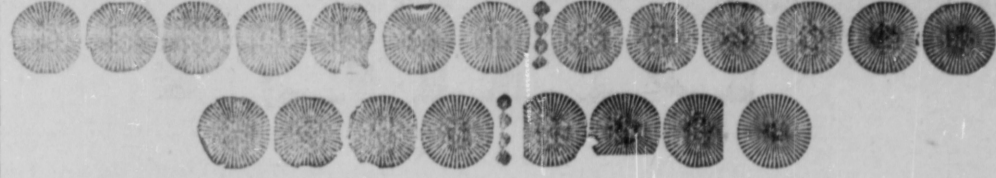

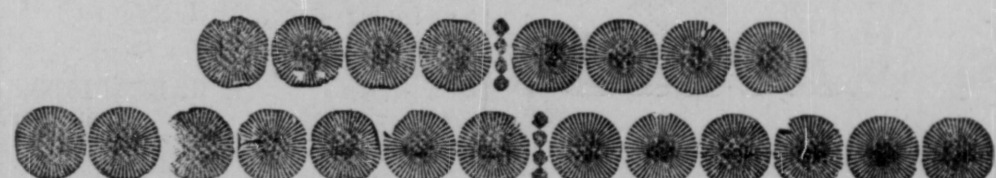
