South R. Quay Contract Let

OTTAWA (Special)—A contract for \$8997 has been awarded by the Public Works Department to William Whiteway of Murray River, P.E.I., for repairs to the deck of the quay wall at South River, John MacDonald, Conservative MP for Kings, disclosed Thursday. Four tenders were received, he said. Work on the project will start almost immediately.

The project will provide a laminated concrete top on the wharf at Murray Harbour. "It will improve considerably facilities at the present installation now used extensively by the fishermen in the spring and summer and by produce shippers in the fall," Mr. MacDonald said. "When the project is completed at Beach Point, additional lights installed and the dredging program carried out, accommodations for the fisherman in particular throughout the whole of the harbor area should be greatly improved."

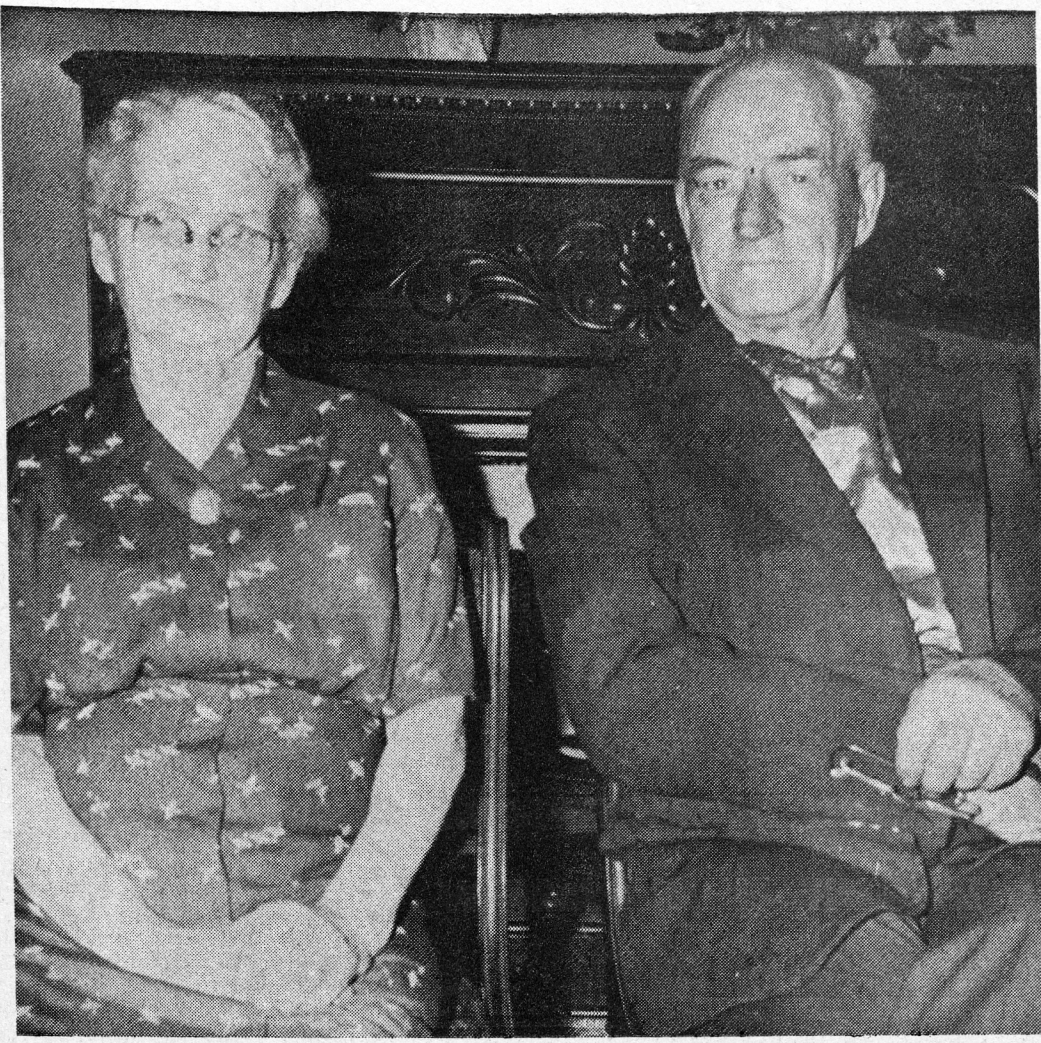

Re-Built Catholic Church At St. Peter's Bay To Be Blessed At Sunday Ceremony

The formal opening and blessing of the recently-rebuilt Roman Catholic Church at St. Peter's Bay will be held Sunday afternoon. Commencing at 4:00 p.m. Pontifical High Mass will be celebrated by the Most Rev. Malcolm A. MacEachern, D.D., Bishop of Charlottetown.

Assisting during the Mass will be Rev. Dr. J. P. E. O'Hanley, Cardigan; Rev. Bennett MacDonald, St. George's; Rev. Emmett McInnis, Lennox Island; Rev. Wilfred Keefe, Rollo Bay, and Rev. Francis Ledwell, St. Dunstan's University.

The sermon will be preached by the Rt. Rev. R. V. MacKenzie, pastor of St. Pius Tenth parish, Parkdale.

Following the ceremony the ladies of the parish will serve coffee and sandwiches in the Parish Hall.

Rebuilding the present edifice was commenced by the M. F. Schurman Company late in the fall of 1957, and completed early this Spring.

The entire front and side walls, consisting of several thicknesses of brick were removed and replaced with wood. This was found necessary as the original brick walls had deteriorated under the action of moisture and frost.

In addition a complete new lower capped with a short spire was constructed. The reconstruction job was

carried out under the direction of Albert MacEwen, a former resident of the district, now employed by the Schurman Company.

Next, the interior of the church was painted, and the surrounding lawns cleaned up and beautified. The entire project, the subject of much favorable comment in the past few weeks, was supervised by the Pastor, Rev. George MacDonald.

OTTAWA (CP) — John Caron, Montreal house builder, Thursday told a Senate committee that, barring a swing to lower-cost homes, he doubts whether the government - forecast target of 140,000 housing units can be

built this year. "There is not sufficient buying power," said Mr. Caron, who appeared as vice-chairman of the Canadian Construction Association's housing committee.

He told the Senate finance committee that that opinion is his own. Minutes earlier a CCA brief read to the committee said it "would appear" forecasts will be borne out of a construction year topping the 1955 record of 131,000 units.

The brief, stemming from a CCA housing conference here last week, emphasized proposals to reduce housing costs and improve financial arrangements to permit persons of lower incomes to buy homes.

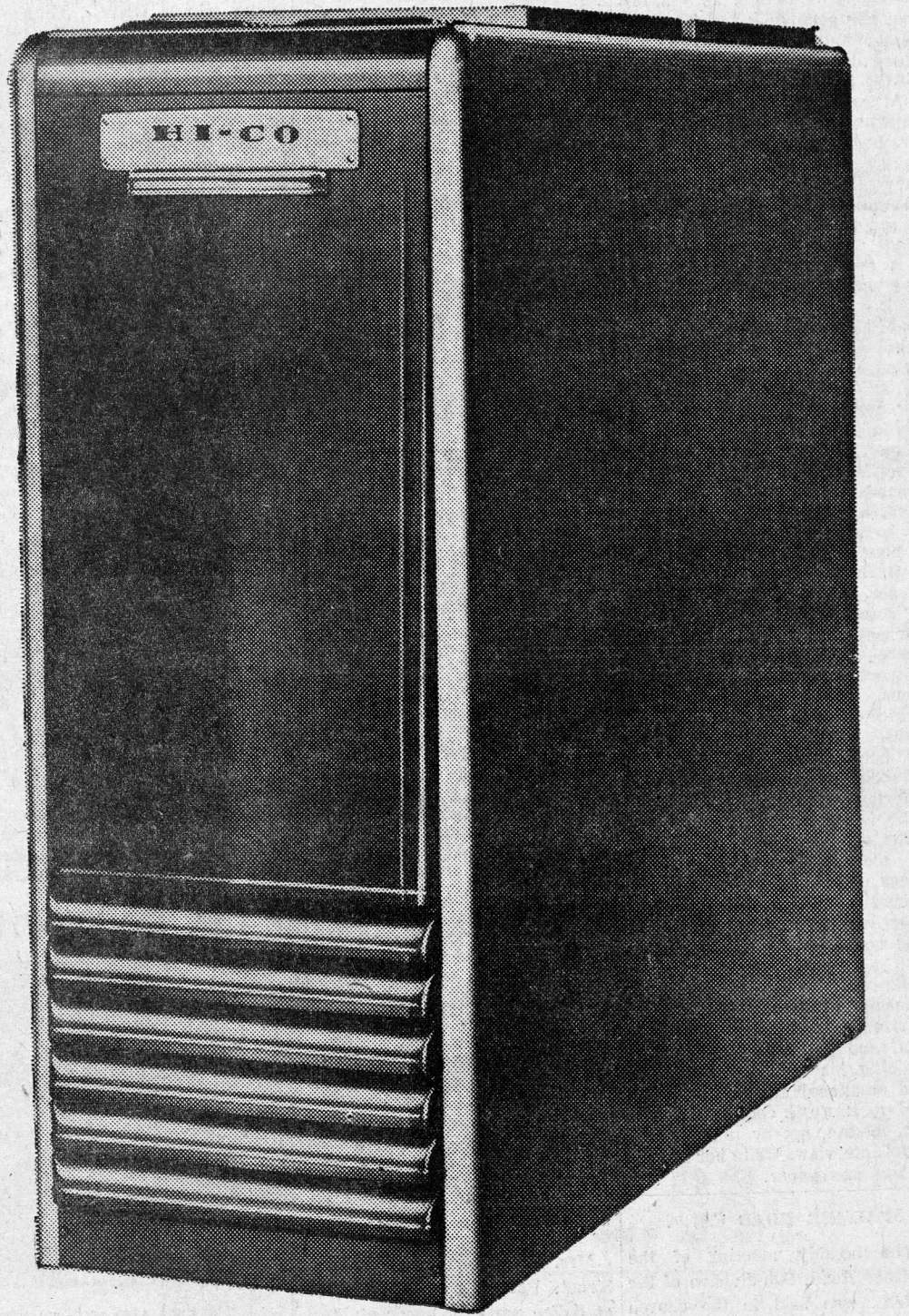
