**CONTRACT BRIDGE**

**North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.**

**NORTH**

**The bidding:**  
North East South West  
1♣ Pass 1NT Pass  
3NT

Opening lead—jack of spade.  
Overbidding sometimes has its rewards, since declarer is put on his mettle to try for more tricks than the cards apparently warrant.

South found himself in three notrump through no particular fault of his own. North's diamond bid was certainly proper, and so was the follow-up informative double of one spade to show his big hand.

South had to choose between responding one notrump or two diamonds, and voted in favor of the notrump bid. In view of his previous two bids, North should have been content to say only two notrump, which would have represented his actual strength adequately, but he chose instead to bid three.

The jack of spades was opened and East, having no rapid side entry to his hand, allowed declarer to win with the queen.

South was not very bright from South's viewpoint. East appeared marked with a six-card spade suit, judging from the lead of the spade jack. The most promising suit in which to gain tricks was diamonds, but this involved a finesse into the danger hand.

There being no alternative, though, he led the jack of diamonds. West covered with the queen, much to South's satisfaction, and four diamond tricks were cashed. East discarded a heart and a club.

The A-K of clubs were next cashed. East followed to one but had to discard a spade on the other in order to protect the king of hearts.

By this time South had taken seven tricks and the defense none. It was apparent from East's discard of a spade that he had relinquished a spade winner to guard his heart king.

East's last six cards, therefore, had to consist of four spades and K-x of hearts. So declarer led the ten of spades from dummy and permitted East to cash four spade tricks.

But East then had to lead a heart and South, who was by now down to Q-x of hearts, was able to make the last two tricks and the contract.

**On The Seaway Hees Favors Use Of Pilots**

OTTAWA (CP)—Transport Minister Hees said Tuesday he doesn't think national security requires that deep-sea vessels using the St. Lawrence Seaway should carry pilots.

He told the Commons railways committee that to require such vessels to carry pilots when they are not needed will only increase shipping charges.

Douglas Fisher (COF—Port Arthur) said the United States Coast Guard doesn't agree with that view.

"I don't care whether the U.S. Coast Guard agrees or not," Mr. Hees said. "That is the opinion of the transport department."

Mr. Fisher noted that the U.S. is proposing to make it mandatory for ships to carry pilots when they are in American waters in the Great Lakes area.

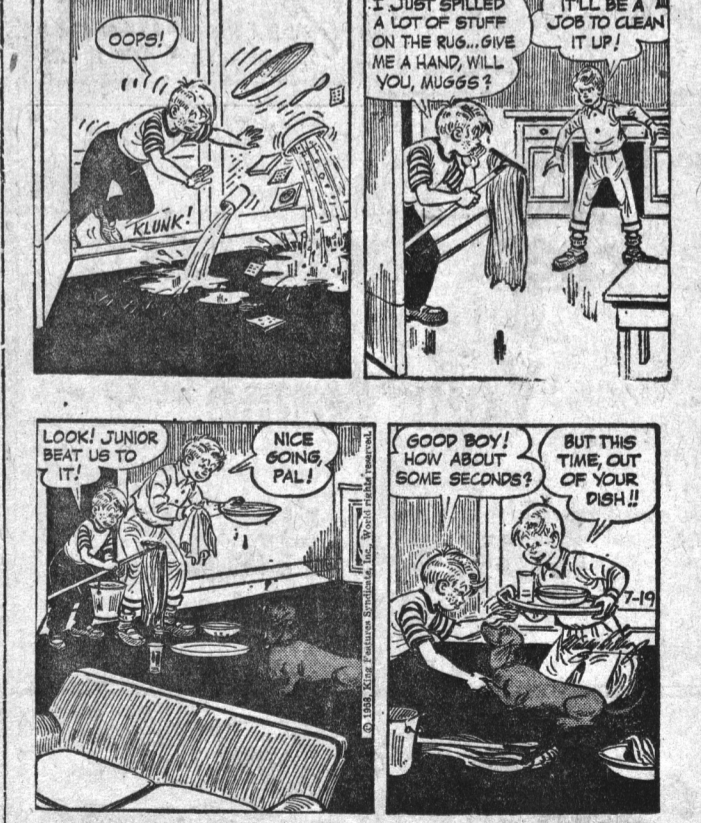

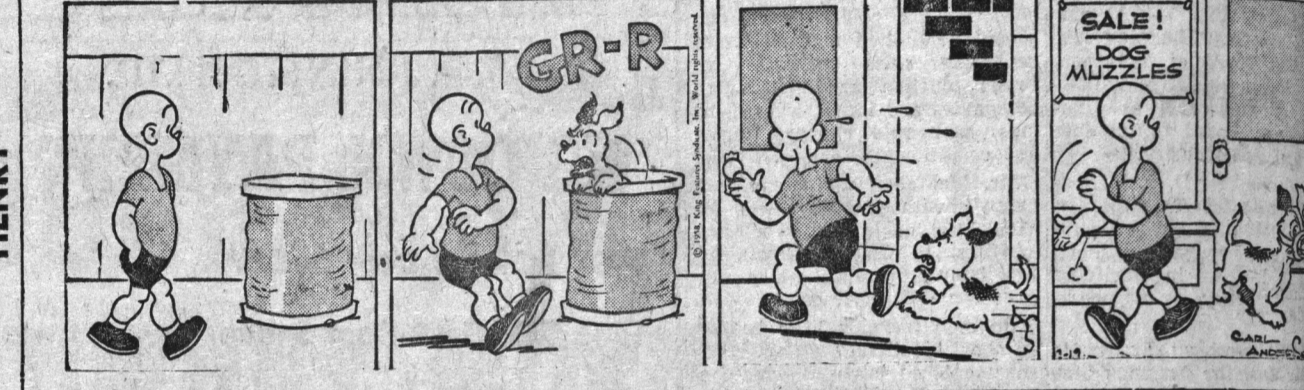
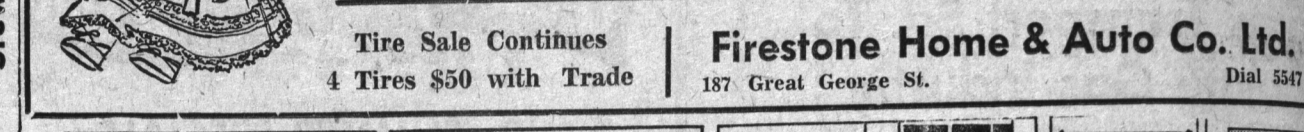
