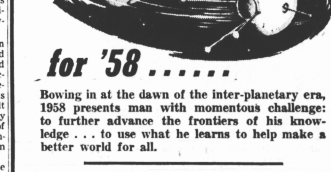
Santa Bails Out Eight At Halifax
