Adoption Of Act Revisions May Bring Many Changes

OTTAWA (CP)—Adoption of Finance Minister Sharp's proposed Bank Act revision this fall or winter is going to force a considerable change among the men who sit around the board room table of many of Canada's big corporations. One of the main objectives of Mr. Sharp's bill, introduced over opposition objections in the Commons, is to break up existing interlocking corporate directorates, particularly as between the chartered banks and the trust and loan companies that accept deposits from the public—the so-called near-banks.

Peasants Massacre Field Mice

PEKING (Reuters)—More than 100,000 peasants and herdsmen in the Lhasa River Valley, in Tibet, have massacred field mice in a campaign given ideological significance by Peking's official People's Daily. The newspaper, organ of the Chinese Communist party, publishes on its front page a report that Tibetans were "expanding a revolutionary movement to break the tough fetters" of the former feudal system.

Russia's Deputy Premier Gives Comments On Trip

That's the conclusion of Dmitri Polyansky, Soviet deputy premier, after a six-week, Canadian tour that took him from Montreal to Vancouver Island. The dark-haired 49-year-old, tagged by most Kremlin observers as the man most likely to succeed Premier Alexei Kosygin, made the comment in an interview as his RCAF plane flew from Calgary to Ottawa at the end of a busy 11-day trip.
