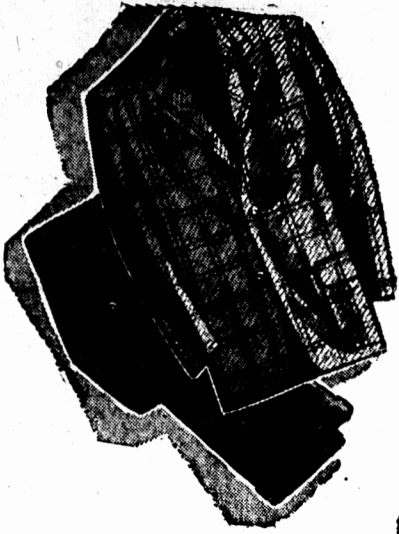

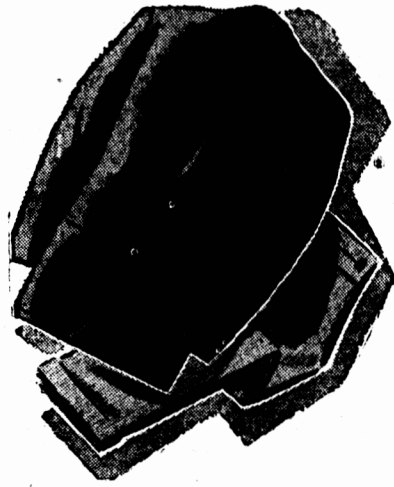

WALLY KOSTER

—After a triumphant football game, the locker-room showers rang with the voice of the victorious team singing "Sweet Adeline" with plenty of gusto. Wally Koster singing along blithely with the rest of the boys, soon found he was doing a solo. The boys had stopped singing to listen. That note at the Football Dance, they coaxed him to sing with the orchestra. Wally says he never felt so embarrassed in all his life, standing up there singing in front of all those people. But his shyness was soon overcome when the dancers called for encore after encore. Upon the insistence of his friends he took an audition and soon found that not only did people enjoy his singing but offers for jobs started coming in. For two years he jobbed at the various Railway Hotels playing Trombone and doing the vocals. From there joined the CBC in Winnipeg (his home town), and sang on the radio show with Woodhouse and Hawkins in 1938 for 1 year. When he joined Joe Decourcy's band in 1939, he sang at the Chateau Laurier in Ottawa and Jasper National Park. In college Wally Koster was an all round Athlete, playing basketball, baseball, football and hockey. He trained with the New York Americans but before he had a chance to turn to professional hockey, the war came along and Wally joined the Army. Soon after shedding his uniform, he started his own band and played at The Flame in Winnipeg. Encouraged by his pretty young wife to move on to bigger and better fields, Wally decided to come to Toronto. There he joined Ellis McLintock's band. One Tuesday night listening to a Borden's "Canadian Cavalcade" program, his wife said to him, "You know dear, someday I hope you will sing with Mart Kenney's orchestra, because that's where I feel you belong". That wish came true, when Mart Kenney heard Wally sing and offered him a job. Now Wally's deep rich voice is a part of Canada's No. 1 Orchestra.

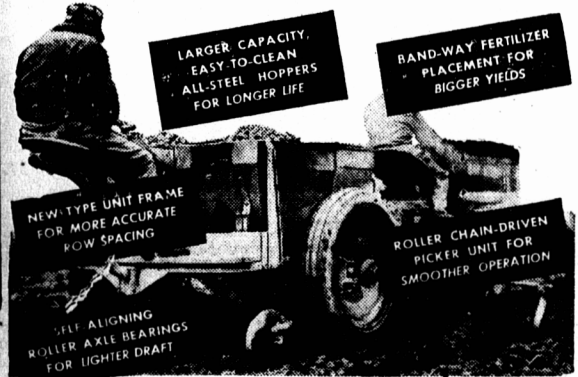
