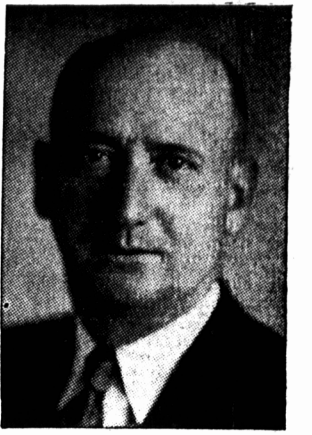

Elected Chairman Of Board Of Directors

The Hon. Jules A. Brillant, M.L.C., C.B.E., was elected chairman of the Board of Directors of the Provincial Bank of Canada. This nomination was made recently at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The Provincial Bank of Canada held in Montreal. The Hon. Jules A. Brillant, M.L.C., C.B.E., member of the Legislative Council for the Division of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, has devoted most of his life to the economic development of the Lower St. Lawrence area. Born in 1888, at St. Octave de Metis, he studied at the University of St. Joseph of New Brunswick. From modest beginnings with various local bank branches, and particularly with the Bank of Hochelaga, he worked his way up and eventually founded the Power Company of Lower St. Lawrence and the Quebec Telephone Corporation which has become the second largest system in the Province of Quebec. Patron of specialized training in the Gulf region, Mr. Brillant promoted the construction of the Trade and Art School of Rimouski, which is to-day the Technical School of the town. He is also credited with the establishment of both the Marine and Commerce Schools of Rimouski. In 1937 he inaugurated his own radio station, CJBR, which has today a power of 5,000 watts. Finally, Mr. Brillant acquired, in 1947, the Canada and Gulf Terminal Railway Company, re-organized its finances and improved its services. His outstanding fellow citizens have made the Hon. Jules A. Brillant one of the most successful and remarkable personalities of our present economic life. Chairman of the Board

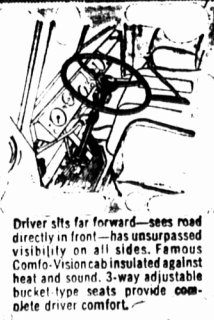
