Jury Awards Civil Damages

Yesterday afternoon in Supreme Court, Mr. Justice Mark MacGuig, presiding, the Civil Action for false representation, brought against Lorne Bowness by Dorothy Green and Ralph Green was concluded, with the civil jury finding against the defendant on two counts but throwing out a third. The plaintiffs then were awarded \$300 for insolation and \$500 for general repairs, while the claim of \$200 for replacement of a furnace, was dismissed.

Appearing for the plaintiffs (Mr. and Mrs. Green) were J. A. Macdonald, Q.C. and Allison M. Gillis, while R. R. Bell, Q.C. and G. R. Foster appeared for the defendant.

The civil jury were: Allison MacRae (foreman), Philip Matheson, William L. MacRae, Louis Sherren, James Lafferty, William Clow, and Wilfred Streich.

Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP) — The Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges were irregularly lower Tuesday at the close of moderate trading. Price changes were fractional with a few issues moving over a point.

Algonia was actively up 7 points while Stelco added 1/2 in a mixed steel group. National Steel Corp. slipped 1/2 and Atlas was off 1/2. Papers were mainly lower as International lost 1/2 and Fraser eased 3/4. Great Lakes tacked on 1/2.

Utility issues were generally steady although International Power added 5 points in light turnover while Shawinigan faded a point. Aluminium climbed one point and Noranda was off a similar figure but the rest of the base metal section was unchanged.

Refining oils were mixed in a narrow range as was the beverage section. Royal lost a point in the bank.

Mines and western oils were mainly lower under the 10-cent mark. Beatrice, Canuba, Montague, New Formaque and New Jaquelin were among the losers while Nu Age and New Jack Lake gained small amounts.

The stock exchange's closing averages show banks off 0.20 at 51.48, utilities up 0.3 at 135.9, industrials off 0.1 at 302.1, combined unchanged at 246.7, papers off 1.34 at 1589.59 and golds off 0.14 at 82.23.

TORONTO (CP) — Industrials featured the stock market Tuesday, staging a determined rally. The rest of the market took on an irregular and dull tone, with some issues showing scattered strength.

Senior base metals were mixed to a little higher with International Nickel, Noranda, Falconbridge and Hudson Bay ahead fractionally. Quebec lost 1/2 and Gaspe Copper was off 1/2 in light trading. Belcher added 18 cents among juniors and New Royray was up 15 cents. Granduc lost 20 cents.

Western oils touched higher ground but Great Plains dropped 2 1/2 points. Calgary and Edmonton, Bailey-Selburn, Pacific Petroleum and Peace River Gas gained between 1/2 and 1. Royalite was off 1/2.
