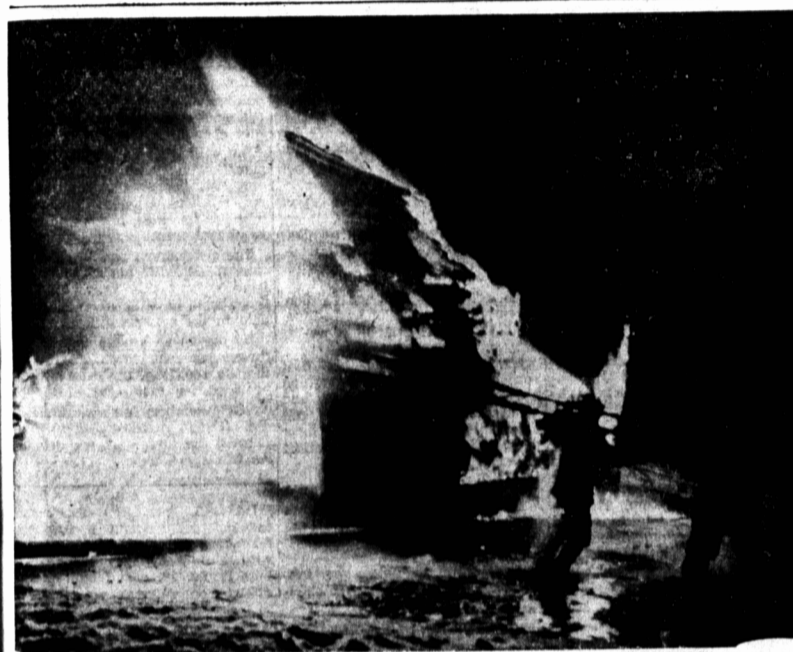




FIRE-TEST AUDITORIUM CURTAINS

Cut Export Flour Price

WINNIPEG (CP) — The Canadian wheat board Friday announced a price adjustment plan that will reduce the price of Canadian flour to certain importing countries. The United States, the United Kingdom and other European countries are excluded from the plan.

It is understood the plan is aimed at meeting the competition of certain exporters, mainly the United States, which has a subsidy favoring flour exports.

The amount of the price adjustment is to be announced by the wheat board Friday.

A spokesman said Friday's adjustments for flour exports via Canadian Atlantic or U.S. Atlantic ports is 4 1/2 cents a bushel; via St. Lawrence ports and Churchill, Man., 3 cents a bushel; via Canadian Pacific and U.S. Pacific ports, 8 cents a bushel.

FIXED AT EXPORT

The wheat board Friday quoted a price of \$1.68 1/2 cents a bushel for No. 1 northern wheat.

Trade sources said an example of the effect of the new policy would be as follows: Millers would pay the wheat board 4 1/2 cents less than this for a bushel of wheat milled into flour and shipped Friday from Halifax to Bombay.

The wheat board buys virtually all the wheat produced in Canada and controls all sales. There is no trading in wheat on the Winnipeg grain exchange.

Millers buy wheat from the wheat board on a provisional price basis. The final price is based on the market price the day the flour is exported.

"The export flour adjustment in effect at the time the final price is established with the board will be the rate used to determine the final price for the contract," the board said in its bulletin.
