Climbing Deficits Predicted For Provinces, Municipalities

OTTAWA (CP)—Combined provincial and municipal deficits totalling more than \$2,000,000,000 by 1971-72 are suggested in budget projections released here after the federal provincial fiscal conference.

The projections anticipate that at the same time the federal government will have moved to a surplus position of between \$325,000,000 and \$725,000,000.

The predictions are subject to vast qualification, and the danger of public misinterpretation of their usefulness and meaning plagued deliberations of the conference this week.

The 10 premiers, saying the figures strengthened provincial demands for a big transfer of tax resources from the federal government, pressed for publication.

With release of the figures Friday went a statement by federal Finance Minister Sharp noting they are "not forecasts of what will actually happen."

The projections, prepared by the continuing federal-provincial committee on tax structure, make these main points:

—Provincial and municipal expenditures to climb to between \$16,000,000,000 and \$16,250,000,000 by 1971-72, assuming an 8 1/2 per cent annual growth rate and including programs already planned.

Federal expenditures to climb to between \$12,750,000,000 and \$13,000,000,000 by 1971-72, assuming a 6 1/2 per cent annual growth rate.

—Provincial and municipal revenues to rise to between \$12,500,000,000 and \$14,000,000,000 by 1971-72, assuming present tax rates and a growth in the gross national product of six or seven per cent a year.

—Federal revenues to rise to between \$13,000,000,000 and \$13,750,000,000 by 1971-72, again assuming existing tax rates and the same GNP growth.

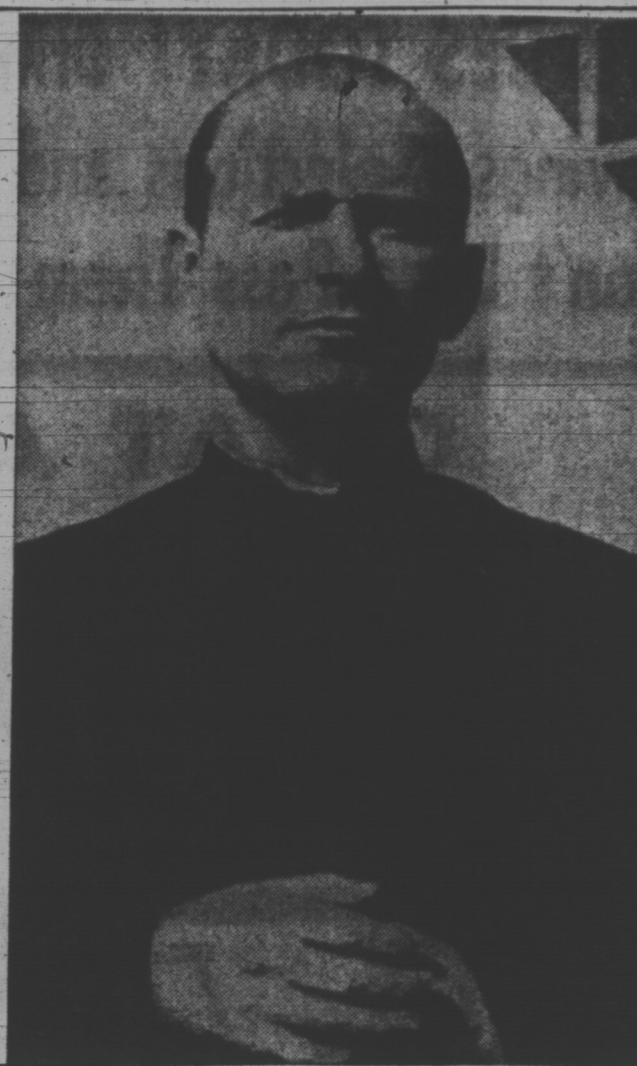
—Provincial and municipal deficits thus to increase from the current level of about \$900,000,000 to between \$2,100,000,000 and \$2,400,000,000 by 1971-72.

—The federal position of approximate balance this year thus to turn into a surplus of \$325,000,000 to \$725,000,000 by 1971-72.

The projections do not include recent federal commitments totalling more than \$500,000,000 for which some tax increases will be necessary.

Mr. Sharp adds in his accompanying statement that in time of surplus it would be the duty of the federal government to reduce its taxes, offsetting higher provincial taxes.

Will Of General Tojo Found After 18 Years

From Agence France-Presse TOKYO (CP)—The will of the executed General Hideki Tojo, Japanese prime minister during the Second World War, found after 18 years, has been certified authentic by experts, it was learned here.

The document was received from an anonymous sender in August by Ichiro Kiyose, former speaker of the House of Representatives, who submitted it to experts two months ago.

He is writing a series of articles in the newspaper Yomiuri on "unrevealed facts about the Tokyo tribunal proceedings on the Japanese war criminals."

The testament is divided into three parts: To the people of Britain and the United States, to his compatriots, the Japanese and to the youth of Japan.

In the first part, Tojo told Britain and the U.S.: "We lost the war because you were stronger and not because you had right on your side. History will eventually prove this to be the case."

He then denounced the United States for using atomic bombs "to kill more than 800,000 innocent people."

WARNERS OF MORE WARS "If the use of the atom bomb is not banned there will be a third, fourth and fifth world wars and the whole of mankind will be destroyed," Tojo wrote.

In his message to the Japanese people, Tojo said the "greater East Asia war" was provoked by "them" and "we were forced to fight for the sake of national existence and in the people's self-defence."

"If fair public opinion were to judge who was responsible for the war, it would be apparent that they were responsible and not we. We lost the war, but the fight was with us."

Tojo enjoined Japanese not to lose heart because of the defeat, but to believe in the destiny of Japan, "which is a nation of the gods, an eternal and imperishable state."

For the youth of Japan, Tojo had words of admonition. He told them "not to be subservient to the strong, not to follow blindly the distorted doctrines"

New Magazine Gets Welcome

OTTAWA (CP)—Science Affairs, a new magazine aimed at sipping the brain drain in the bud, won a warm welcome from Centennial Commissioner John Fisher at its press conference launching here.

He described it as "one of those truly worthwhile" centennial undertakings. The first issue of the Youth Science Foundation publication will appear in January.

Next week, 20,000 copies of a pilot issue will be mailed to high school students. They'll be asked to subscribe to eight 1967 issues at \$3 a year.

The foundation says the magazine is "designed" to inform Canadian high school students and to awaken their interest in a scientific future in Canada.

Eighteen major scientific, educational and technological societies created the foundation, formerly the Canadian Science Fairs Council.

The sleek, time-sized magazine will feature articles by leading Canadian scientists. They'll be written specifically for high school students.

The magazine will offer a silver trophy each year to the advertiser it feels has done the most to check the "brain drain"—the flow of Canadian scientific talent to other countries, mainly the U.S.

Articles on space photography, chemical reactions and the continental drift appear in the pilot issue as well as a piece by Vancouver humorist Eric Nicol entitled: "Confessions of a boy genius in a high school science lab."

Science Affairs would be an English-language counterpart to Le Jeune Scientifique, which has served French-speaking students in Canada for years.
