

Evidence is Completed In Liquor Selling Case

GEORGETOWN — Evidence in the case of Benedict Joseph Lutz, Peakes Road, charged with selling liquor was completed here yesterday before Kings County Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, and was adjourned to March 13 for argument by counsel.

Two Crown Witnesses had been heard earlier and the evidence of Cpl. Douglas J. Hender, RCMP, Montague detachment, was completed yesterday. The accused did not give evidence or call witnesses.

Lutz is represented by J.P. Nicholson, and Deputy Attorney General J. Arthur McGilligan represented the Crown in all cases.

John Charles Martell, Georgetown, charged with unlawful

possession of two paint brushes had the evidence completed in his case. Police evidence was heard at an earlier sitting and yesterday Mr. and Mrs. Royal White, Murray River, gave evidence for the Crown. Both testified a paint brush as being theirs and as being in their cottage at Brudenell.

The accused did not give evidence or call witnesses. He is represented by G.R. Foster, QC. The case was taken under consideration and adjourned to Charlottetown, March 13 for judgment.

A man charged with having liquor in a place other than his residence had his case adjourned to March 13 for hearing.

Frederick L. Morrison, Peters Road, was fined \$25 and costs for having liquor not purchased from a vendor, and two others were each fined \$20 and costs for having liquor in a place other than their residence. Another man was fined \$20 and costs for being intoxicated in a public place.

Donald James Ross, Lower Montague, charged with failing to report for vehicle inspection and who is represented by Kenneth R. MacDonald, had his case adjourned for hearing, March 27.

Roy Hector Biell, Murray River, was fined \$10 and costs for parking his motor vehicle where a clear view of the motor vehicle could not be obtained for a distance of 60 feet in each direction. Edward Albert Clow, Montague, was fined \$10 and costs for having defective equipment on his motor vehicle.

Lloyd Penna Sanderson, Brudenell pleaded not guilty to driving while his license was cancelled. He is represented by Mr. Nicholson. His case was adjourned to March 13.

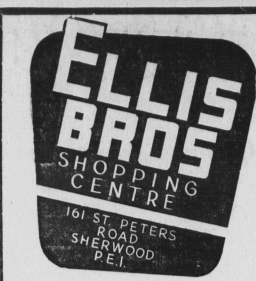
During the operation, ice was removed from the Wood Islands hill, including a bump caused by water swelling up from underground and running down the road in small quantities recently.
