

NEW BRUNSWICK.

CONFEDERATION IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

In the Council's Address in reply to the Speech, the paragraph referring to Confederation read as follows:—

The Correspondence on the affairs of British North America, which Your Excellency announces will immediately be laid before us by command of Her Majesty, laid before us at our hands that care-fully and respectfully attention due to matters emanating from the North-western Territory, and with an anxious desire to meet the wishes of Her Majesty's Government so far as may be consistent with the true interests and prosperity of the Province.

On Monday the Hon. E. B. Chandler moved to expunge the words which have italicized, and insert a stronger affirmation of Union principles, namely:—

The Council (on Monday) having received the concluding paragraph, relating to Union, Hon. Mr. Chandler urged the members of the Government to strike out the qualifying words on Union, and he would move an amendment which would direct the Council to express its opinion on the subject of the Union as being advantageous to New Brunswick. Mr. Odell wished time to consider, in other words to consult the Attorney General.
