### Maxim Puts Boxing Crown On Line Wednesday

NEW YORK, Aug. 19 (AP)—Joe Maxim of Cleveland hauls his world light-heavyweight boxing crown out of cold storage at Madison Square Garden next Wednesday night against Irish Bob Murphy, the red-haired buzz-saw from San Diego, Calif.

"If he don't run, I'll knock him out," Murphy predicted boldly as he polished off training at his camp in Greenwood Lake, N. Y. At Summit, N. J., the champion down to what he calls his sharpest fighting trim, was a bit less emphatic, saying: "I think I can beat him—I got to."

The 15-round battle, Maxim's first defence since he knocked out Freddie Mills of England to capture the championship on Jan. 24, 1950, will be telecast and broadcast over the CBS network at 10 p. m. EDT.

In addition to the millions who are expected to witness the bout by TV, some 10,000 are expected to pay \$50,000 to watch in the flesh as the gladiators try to dismember each other.
