ment only the naming of an agency by the United States Government now prevents a start on construction of the power works. Canada has named the Ontario Hydro-Electric Commission as its agency and a Washington dispatch today said the New York State Power Authority has already applied for a licence to construct the works on the American side of the river. The two agencies will split the cost of the project and the power to be developed. Canada already has undertaken to build the \$500,000,000 seaway to open the Great Lakes system to ocean-going ships, if the commission approved the power scheme. The United States Congress persistently has rebuffed proposals that Canada and the U. S. build the seaway together.

May Start Next Year

At Ottawa, Transport Minister Chevrier expressed hope before a luncheon of the National Federation of Liberal Women that construction of the seaway will start next year and estimated that the over-all cost of the project will be \$750,000,000. This is \$50,000,000 more than previously estimated. Mr. Chevrier later told reporters the power development will cost \$450,000,000 and the seaway \$300,000,000. Original estimate for the power plan was \$400,000,000.

The commission's announcement followed two days of closed executive meetings here at which it studied the application and the results of a series of public hearings both in Canada and the United States.

Eden Denies Diplomat Was Confessed Red

LONDON, Oct. 29—(Reuters)—Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden today denied a report that a British diplomat serving in Washington at one time had confessed Communist beliefs in a record made at a party.

Guy Burgess, who with fellow diplomat Donald MacLean has been missing for the last 18 months, recorded a "comic imitation" of a "quite well-known public figure," Eden said. He did not identify the figure, but there was little doubt here that Burgess mimicked the tones of Britain's most famous orator, Prime Minister Churchill.

Eden did not deny, however, that both diplomats had Communist beliefs, as charged in the House of Lords Tuesday. Lord Elton, an independent peer, then said that the record, reported to be in the hands of the F.B.I. in Washington, was made by MacLean and professed him to be a gospel-spreading Communist.

Eden said the charges in the House of Lords probably resulted from a misunderstanding of the fact that Burgess had made a record on the night before he left Washington in May, 1951. This was three years after MacLean had left and there was no reference to MacLean in the recording, he said.

But nothing in the recording, which Eden has not heard but has received reports on, indicated that Burgess had Communist sympathies. Its content bore no relation to his disappearance later, he added.
