Salvation Army Auditor in City

Brigadier Harold Wellman, national auditor of the Salvation Army, with headquarters in Toronto is visiting the city on the last lap of an official tour which took him from the Pacific to the Atlantic, and will terminate at St. John's Nfld. next week.

Brigadier Wellman was born in England, the son of parents with 64 years service as Salvation Army officers. He went to the United States early in life and in due course went overseas with the 109th. Infantry of the 28th. Division, United States Army in the First World War.

On returning from overseas, the Brigadier entered the training school for Salvation Army officers in New York and was commissioned at that service in 1920. While stationed in Birmingham, Alabama in 1924, he was transferred to Winnipeg.

Brigadier Wellman went overseas once again in 1939 with the First Canadian Division where he remained until 1942. He was appointed War Services Inspector for the Salvation Army in Canada at that time, and in this capacity made his only former visit to the Island when his duties called him to Beach Grove in 1944.

During his stay here, the Brigadier is a guest at Sunset Lodge which he finds a splendid addition to the Salvation Army homes.
