Saints Edge Summerside For First Win Of Season

Saint Dunstan's hockey team came up with the biggest upset of the season at the college rink last night when they grabbed their first victory in four starts in the Charlottetown and District Hockey League, edging Summerside Aces 5-4 in what was easily the most exciting game seen around these parts all season.

The Aces got two back in the second and knotted the score at 13:59 of the third but all the comeback went for nothing when Saints potted the winner at 15:24. John R (Jackie) MacDonald led the goal getters with a hat trick performance for the Red and White. He rifled two by Ronnie MacDougall in the first and sank the big one in the final frame that won the hockey game.

Jackie also picked up an assist on Saints' fourth tally scored by Manning, who also helped on three other markers. Ray Hache got the other S.D.U. goal and assisted on another. Garth Harris, a Summerside boy and brother of Aces' Vance, was playmaker on three Saints' tallies. Reeves led the losers with two unassisted goals. The other marksmen were Ulric Gallant and Bonnie Howatt.

The third period produced the greatest excitement, with Aces trying desperately to pull it out and Saints just as desperate to nab their first win. It was the university outfit that got the satisfaction.

The going was rough in the final frame with body checks hurled aplenty. Both teams got in their share of solid blows.

Referee J. Bernard and Maurice Goodwin handed out eight penalties. Seven were minors with Aces drawing four of them. In addition Vance Harris got tagged with a misconduct in the dying moments for throwing his stick.
