The Imperial Institute

The increased interest taken by all classes in Great Britain in Colonial affairs is now receiving fresh stimulus from the completion of the Imperial Institute.

1. The formation and exhibition of collections, representing the raw materials and manufactured products of the Empire.

2. The establishment or promotion of commercial museums, sample rooms, and intelligence offices in London and other parts of the Empire.

3. The collection and dissemination of such information relating to trade and industries, to emigration, and other purposes of the charter as may be of use to the subjects of the Empire.

4. The furtherance of systematic colonization. In brief, emigration and the fostering trade between Great Britain and her colonies, is the surest means of tightening the bonds of union.

SIR,—The by-law regulating the maximum rate at which a horse may be driven on the streets of this city was, without doubt, framed with the intention of protecting the lives and limbs of citizens.

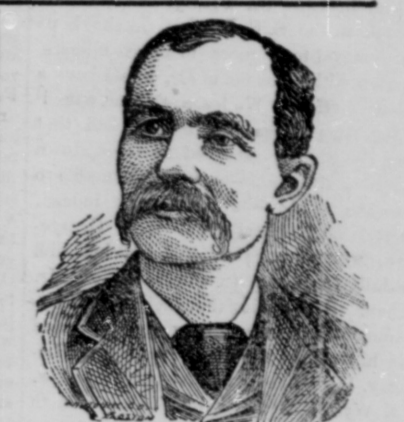
