(Continued from page one) to an act to amend the Gasoline Tax Act and this amendment provided that the owner of a vehicle is permitted to have it operated on provincial highways, powered by taxed, leaded or unleaded gasoline, but that the operator of such a vehicle could be charged with an offence if the vehicle is used for an offence of the law.

The M. J. Bonnell (L-44) Kings called the amendment "poor legislation." He said "farmers or fishermen who loaned his vehicle to someone else who later put marked gas in it could be convicted of an offence under the bill. Attorney General Alvin Farnham said the amendment "provides for people who wish to evade the law."

Bonnell moved an amendment that would exempt farmers and fishermen from this section of the act but his motion was lost on a straight party vote.

OTHER BILLS

Second reading was given to a number of bills presented by the Provincial Secretary and Municipal Affairs Minister J. David Stewart.

An act to amend the Town Planning Act provided that any municipality may, upon request to the government, come under the provisions of the act.

The amendment also contained a section which would allow a peace officer, seeing new construction going on in an area, to enter the premises, to see whether or not the person carrying out the construction had a permit under the act.

An amendment to the Towns Act, provides that a town council may acquire "any lands or areas within or adjacent to the boundaries of the town" if the council thinks them to be adjacent to the town.

Mr. Stewart also introduced for second reading an act to amend the City of Charlottetown Incorporation Act. Progress was reported on this bill as more information was needed on one section and the bill will be returned to the committee stage later in the session.

The amendment grants to the city the power to impose a business occupancy tax based on floor space or on the rental value or assessed value of a property.

If the tax is based on floor space, such floor space may be assigned basic values which are variable according to the estimated value of the use of the space as among professions, trades, businesses and other classifications "and also variable within such classification among the types of trades, professions and businesses."

The amendment also provides that the city assessor, on direction of the council, may take a census of city inhabitants at intervals not exceeding four years. The census would be taken according to the following age groups: Fifteen years and under, in which actual age may be shown; males aged 16 to 60, both inclusive in which definite age must be shown; females aged 15 to 55, both inclusive in which definite age must be shown; and males aged over 60 years and females aged over 50 years, in which definite age need not be shown.

During the brief question period yesterday, George Mackay (L-4th Prince) asked Dr. George Dewar, minister of education, whether or not a commission had been set up to zone regional high school areas in the province.

Dr. Dewar replied that such a commission had been in existence for several years. He said, however, that it is a matter of government policy when he was asked whether or not the commission would be setting the boundaries of regional high school areas.

Provincial Treasurer Farnham also brought in two bills for first reading. They were an act to amend the Deposit Receipt Act and an act to amend the Audit Act.

Airlift For Army Forecast In New Federal Estimates

OTTAWA (CP)—A start on formation of a modest airlift for the army was heralded in a \$1,325,000,000 defence budget, smallest in 13 years.

The estimates of defence spending include \$7,000,000 for new transport planes, likely to be the American Lockheed Hercules. The total program is expected to run to more than \$40,000,000.

The 1964-65 defence budget is \$106,000,000 less than that of the 1963-64 fiscal year ending March 31.

The major slash is in the fund for new weapons and equipment—down to \$204,000,000 from \$280,000,000 or to 13.4 per cent of the defence budget compared with 16 per cent in the

Continuing CF-104 Bomber Tutor Jet Trainer and Helicopter Programs

The defence department's \$20,000,000 development program, an increase of \$5,000,000, is mainly for the naval hydrofoil boat which will not be ready for sea trials until September.

The appropriation for four new satellites to be launched between 1965 and 1970 is increased to \$2,933,000 from \$2,700,000.
