Local and Other Items.

GRAIN IN ENGLAND.—Harvesting of rye has begun in Great Britain. The Mark Lane express says that wheat and barley promise a full average yield, but that the oat crop is distinctly deficient.

ARSENIC ORE.—The Ontario Government is making enquiries regarding a reported rich find of arsenic ore between Lakes Timagamingue and Tamagaming, in the wilds of Northern Ontario. Finds of arsenical ore in small quantities have been reported from that region before, but if present reports are borne out, the richest vein in the world has been struck.

THE GASPERIA.—The Canadian liner Gasperia, which was adrift in the gulf of St. Lawrence surrounded by ice floes all winter, and was taken to St. John's Nfld, by the steamer Kite, was sold on Friday by order of the Supreme Court to pay the salvage awarded the Kite. She was bought by Captain Farquhar of Halifax for \$270,000. Captain Farquhar intends to run the steamer between New York, Halifax and St. John's.

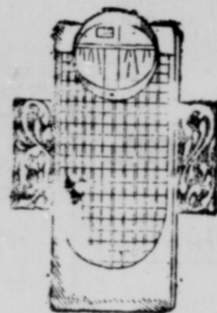
