A recreational membership will appeal to those who wish to enjoy fencing for exercise and pure fun.

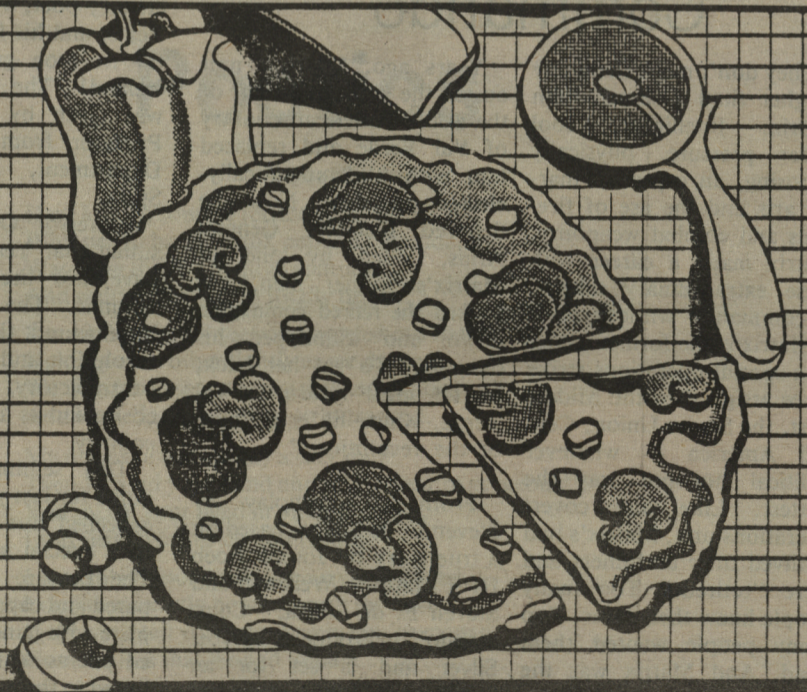
The P.E.I. fencing club meets in the U.P.E.I. gym every Saturday morning at 11:00. So if you are interested in something just a little bit different, come and join the club!
