Appeal Cases Heard Yesterday At Summerside

Presiding at the Appeal Court in Summerside yesterday morning was Judge George J. Tweedy who dismissed the appeal of Emmanuel S. Gallant, of Summerside. He was convicted of possession of illicit spirits on September 24, 1957 in the Magistrate's Court. The appellant was then fined \$500 and six months in jail and an additional six months in default of payment by Magistrate R. S. Hinton, Q. C. This was his second conviction under the Excise Act. The appellant's counsel was Allison Gillis.

The second appellant was a resident of Alberton, Leo Francis MacDunn, who was convicted of selling intoxicating liquor. After the court learned that this appellant was in the Western Hospital, Judge Tweedy took the case under advisement. The counsel for the defence produced a doctor's certificate stating the appellant was not medically fit to appear in court. A motion was made by the prosecution that a warrant be issued for his arrest and that he be brought to court. Attorney Allison Gillis also appeared for this appellant.
